1) Water running down Kelmarsh Road from a natural spring. Gully to take the water has been requested from Highways – need photo when the water is running again

- 2) The trees on Kelmarsh Road are overgrown and need to be cut back. 8118356 expected completion by 6/3/26 A qualified Highways Inspector has assessed the location and we can confirm that in accordance with the WNC Highways Inspection Manual, the vegetation meets the criteria for a Priority 4 response. We will schedule vegetation clearance to be completed within 26 weeks. Our current average response time for a Priority 4 is 59 days.
- 3) The clerk to request a new 'Keep Junction Clear' sign at the Junction between Kelmarsh Road and Oxendon Road. From Highways - Thank you for your enquiry. A qualified Highways Inspector has assessed the location, and we can confirm that in accordance with the WNC Highways Inspection Manual, this defect does not meet the investigatory levels for a repair. We will continue to monitor the condition as part of our routine highway inspection schedule.

The old notice has now been found and will be re-instated.
