MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR CLLR CHRIS MCCREEDY

I always think this is a lovely time of year as we see spring breaking through and the landscape starts to fill with colour. During the winter we have seen progress on several projects, including the completion of the public bench

renovation programme, which has generated a lot of positive feedback and our thanks must go to the local contractor who did an excellent job.

By the time you receive this newsletter, work should also have been completed on improving the appearance and accessibility of the war memorial. In addition to this, we are currently working with the 5th Continent who has available grants, to create an Information Hub and bespoke bench in the eastern corner of the Recreation Ground. This will include a direct access from the RHDR station that will be open during their times of operation.

THE PEOPLE SHOUT A RESOUNDING "NO" TO DEVELOPMENT

Almost 100 members of the public attended the February Parish Council meeting at the Methodist Church to express their objections to an outline planning application to build 132 homes on land adjoining High Knocke Farm Dymchurch (planning reference 21/2525/FH). Residents set out their objections clearly highlighting flooding and sewerage, affordable housing, effects on local infrastructure and services, not to mention the loss of a historic landscape and affects on wildlife. The developers had published a design statement which appeared to indicate that the Parish Council were in full support of this development. This was explained to those attending as a misrepresentation of the Councils views and what followed was all Council members speaking individually to those gathered giving their full support to residents. A vote was held and the Council unanimously objected to the application. This application will now be heard by the District Council Planning Committee who will make the final decision as to whether this will be approved or not. The hearing is expected in April or May this year.





The Parish Council are in the process of applying for a 2022

Seaside Award. The award is a mark of quality management and clean water for beaches across the whole of the UK.

The Seaside Award works towards sustainable development of beaches through strict criteria dealing with water quality, environmental education and information, environmental, management, safety and other services.

The Award winners will be announced in mid-May. Fingers crossed the award flag will be flying on the seawall for the summer season.



GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE

The works commissioned by the Parish Council to make the War Memorial

and Garden more accessible are near to completion. The area now has a flat path from the entrance to the memorial itself and the ground has been raised. Planting will take place over the next few weeks to be ready for the Remembrance Service in November 2022.

DYMCHURCH RESCUE

Dymchurch Beach is set to see some changes this year with lifeguards being introduced starting in April this year. Dymchurch Parish Council suspended the Beach Manager Service back in 2011 and since 2019 after being elected the Parish Council have been working to reintroduce this service to enhance safety and education for those entering or being around water.

Folkestone Rescue an independent charity which provides lifeguards and lifeboats are going to be operating from the main kiosk at the slip way in the centre of the village. They work in partnership with HM Coastguard, RNLI and National Coast Watch.

The service is financed through fund raising and donations and will be a real asset to residents, businesses and visitors to our wonderful beach.

A partnership between Dymchurch Parish Council, the Romney Marsh 5th Continent and the Romney Hythe and Dymchurch Railway ha resulted in an exciting addition proposed for the Eastern corner of the Recreation Ground. The area, which will be a meeting place, information hub and a link between the recreation ground and the popular miniature railway, has been created using funds obtained by the 5th Continent from the Heritage Lottery Fund. An artist impression is of the proposal. A new entrance will be created to

join the recreation ground with the railway station. Information boards will provide information on the history and heritage of our area along with local information with a central circular designed seating area and planting. Work is due to start very soon and we will bring you an update in the next edition.



ELECTIONS 2023

No we haven't gone mad we do know it is 2022. May 2023 seems a long way off but it is never too early to consider if you wish to stand as a Councillor for the Parish Council. Local elections take place next year and we wanted to ensure that all those people who have sat at home thinking I want to make a difference in my community or who have watched in bemusement when decisions

are made and have said "I could have done better than that" now is your chance. In order to stand for Council you must be at least 18 years old, be a British or Commonwealth Citizen. You must also meet at least one of the following:

- 1. You must appear on the electoral register for the Parish or
- 2. You have occupied land or premises for 12 months prior to being nominated or
- 3. You have worked within the Parish for 12 months prior to being nomination or
- 4. You have resided within three miles of the Parish for 12 months prior to being nominated

We are looking for people young and old to stand on the Council to represent the views of all of our residents and businesses. Nearer the time nomination papers will be made available. My Community Voice is a new messaging service from Kent Police that helps residents, businesses, and community groups across the county keep in touch with their local policing teams. Officers will post real-time messages about local matters that may affect you or your community, such as updates on scams, appeals, anti-social behaviour, events and more. This innovative system is more than just a messaging service; it allows you to reply to the alerts officers upload, share information and tell officers about the issues affecting you. You will be able to play an active part in police

appeals as well as being kept up to date with what's happening in your local area. Unlike social media, My Community Voice is a secure and personal messaging system that allows you to determine what type of messages you receive and how. The service sends updates about your local area directly from the police officers themselves. Superintendent Pete Steenhuis said: 'My Community Voice is a great tool that gives the public a chance to get useful information specific to their area while also being active participants in helping to prevent and detect crime and anti-social behaviour. 'It gives local communities the chance to decide exactly what information they receive from Kent Police and enables them to be notified via email, text or voice note. 'Kent Police is committed to engaging with communities across Kent and Medway to help protect people from harm and My Community Voice can further enable the police and public to work together to both reduce and prevent crime.'My Community Voice will allow Kent Police to hear your voice on the issues impacting you in your community either through direct engagement with officers following an alert or through surveys provided by your local officer to the local community. Sign up and make your voice count. To start getting alerts, register your details at www.mycommunityvoicekent.co.uk. Its quick, simple, and completely free. This service is not monitored 24/7 and is not for reporting crimes or incidents. You can report a crime online or via LiveChat at www.kent.police.uk. If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use our textphone service on 18000. In an emergency, call 999.
