The Marlot Local Nature Reserve (LNR)

The Marl Allotment, or Marlot as it is locally known, is a 6-acre parcel of common land situated near Roundthorn Bridge, Canalside in Whixall. It is managed under the ownership of Whixall Parish Council on behalf of the village of Whixall.

In December 2021 the Marlot was awarded Local Nature Reserve (LNR) status in order to promote and enhance its existence and use by members of the local community, wild life organisations and the wider general public.

The site comprises two meadows, a pond area and woodland which are linked by cleared pathways, as well as several rest break seating areas where you can stop and take in the natural beauty and wildlife.



The physical management and care of the site is undertaken by Marlot Conservation Group, currently 4 local parishioners, who give up their time to maintain the area throughout the year. Volunteers are always welcomed. No experience is required, just a willingness to get stuck into a variety of tasks.

Whixall Neighbourhood Watch

Let's keep our homes, property and neighbourhood safe, free from antisocial behaviour and crime.

Neighbourhood Watch is based around the idea of an active community working in partnership with the police and a shared value focussed on bringing local people together.

Which Schemes Operate in Whixall?

Whixall currently has two Neighbourhood Watch schemes: Hollinwood, Sandy Bank, Stanley Green & Welsh End scheme, and Waterloo area scheme.

How do I become a member?

Membership of these schemes is only through an online application via the National Neighbourhood Watch Network (ourwatch.org.uk). Put in your postcode to find you nearest registered scheme. You must, however, first sign up and create and account as a new Neighbourhood Watch Network member before being accepted onto your local scheme.

How do I receive information?

Online membership offers you a number of email alerts, ranging from local police and neighbourhood matters to fraud and national issue alerts – you choose what you want to receive. You can also receive the monthly newsletter from the National Network (Our News) which provides useful articles relating not only to crime prevention but to many social and community issues.

If you do not wish to become a Neighbourhood Watch member but would like to receive free messages from West Mercia Police then sign up for the messaging service at: neighbourhoodmatters.co.uk.
