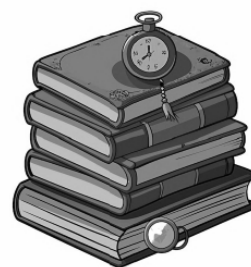

THE VILLAGE ARCHIVE

For many years the remains of a medieval cross were slowly disintegrating in the Churchyard and Kathy Hawley had long been concerned that the cross should return to being an important feature of the Village.

As the anniversary of the end of World War 1 approached, Kathy learned that grants were available for community-based projects commemorating the date. Accordingly, she developed ideas for a project which entailed restoring the remains of the cross as a war memorial and researching the men who had given their lives in order that the memorial should give an accurate portrayal of those entitled to be remembered.

The grant also funded presenting the results of this research to the community in the form of a pageant which would show the men in the context of their families and life in the village.

Restoration of the cross on the Village Green, close to its medieval siting, was completed in 2015 and a play was performed in All Saints Church which depicted life in the village during the war years. The play was performed on the eve of Armistice Day and the following morning the armistice service was held outside by the memorial for the first time. Tea was then provided in the Village Hall where an exhibition marking key events was on display.

A high proportion of the village, including the College community, participated in these events which many commented had been a wonderful example of community inclusiveness.

With all of this completed, Kathy was left with a rich amount of information, documentation, photographs and artefacts which posed the question of what to do with them. In the process of leading the research Kathy and her tireless band of volunteer researchers were also made aware that many people had more material about the village and were unsure what might happen to it in the future.

This led to the idea of setting up an archive to hold any material relevant to the historic life of the village. This would contain material collected during the project and from other sources, including from individuals and village organizations.

At the same time a small group of dedicated volunteers started the Memories Project, with a large amount of information being collected from members of the community. This resulted in publication of the book "Cuddesdon, Denton & Chippinghurst Photographs and Memories" and generated more material for the Archive.

The Village Hall Committee graciously offered a room for the Archive in the Village Hall and later agreed to take management responsibility for the project.

A further grant was secured from South Oxfordshire District Council to refurbish and equip the room and to enable provision of training to another willing group of volunteers to carry out initial cataloging which Mike Mount has kindly agreed to carry forward now that Kathy feels she has done as much as she can.

Kathy wants to emphasise that a key factor in all of the projects was the willingness of the village to support and be involved.

Fifty volunteers were involved in the production of the play. twenty in researching the lives of those who died in World War 1 and, more recently, another twenty in cataloging the archive material already donated.

From Kathy's perspective it is these volunteers contributing in all their roles which enabled these projects to be so successful with effects which will be long lasting. She hopes their efforts will be highlighted and celebrated at the opening of the Archive Room on 29th April, which will include a short video of the filming of the play.

FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends

You're likely reading this during Holy Week, the days leading up to Easter. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, when Christians remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey — an act that signals a very different kind of kingship. A ruler arriving on a donkey comes in humility and peace, not in triumph or war. In doing so, Jesus also fulfils the prophecy that the Messiah would come to his city in just this way. The crowds welcome him as a conquering king, waving palm branches and shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" Yet only days later, many of those same voices call for his crucifixion.

On the night before he died, Jesus shared a final meal with his friends. After supper, he knelt and washed their feet — one of the most moving scenes in Scripture, when our Lord takes the role of a servant. Our late Queen Elizabeth was deeply inspired by this act, as was Graham Kendrick when he wrote "The Servant King," with its reminder that Jesus came "not to be served but to serve." Jesus shows us what true leadership looks like: love expressed through service.

As I look at world events, and see how earthly leaders often misuse and abuse power, I find myself longing for more leaders who resemble Jesus — the good shepherd who feeds and tends his flock.

This Lent, a small group from around the Benefice of Garsington, Cuddesdon and Horspath has been gathering for a simple lunch and to watch Bishop Steven Croft's reflections on how Jesus feeds us in Holy Communion. Sharing food and conversation has been a real joy. As we've talked about Scripture, faith, and discipleship, we've been reminded how friendships and communities grow when we sit and eat together. The Bible paints the Kingdom of Heaven as a great feast, where people come from every direction to share in God's abundance. Around a table, we catch a small glimpse of that promise.

I hope that this Easter you enjoy a good meal with family or friends, and that as you eat and drink together, you remember the example of Jesus — the humble host who invites us to set aside our divisions and be united at his table, where even enemies can become friends.

We would be delighted to welcome you at our services this Holy Week and Easter, in All Saints' Church. On Wednesday 1st April, we have 30 minutes of silent contemplative prayer at 5pm, followed by a spoken Holy Communion Service (BCP) at 6pm. On Maundy Thursday (2nd April) we have Parish Communion at 7.30pm, with foot-washing and the stripping of the altar, followed by a short vigil for those who wish to stay. On Good Friday, from 12 noon, we have readings, hymns, reflections and silence, as we remember Jesus' crucifixion. On Easter Day, at 9.30am, we have a Parish Easter Communion Service, with crème eggs for all, as we celebrate the Resurrection. All are welcome to join us.

Happy Easter, and God bless

On the Parish Council, we continue to press for more action on potholes as it increasingly affects the safety of our roads. Underinvestment over many years has led us to a point where the roads are deteriorating fast and the County Council doesn't have the funds to catch up on all the proper resurfacing that's really needed. There is a scheduled 2-year programme but some of the roads we'd like to be on that list, like Ladder Hill in Wheatley, are not on it. We'll continue to push for updates.

If you're curious to know what we've been discussing at our meetings then you can visit the Cuddesdon and Denton community website where all our minutes and agendas are available. We are currently upgrading the website and councillors are moving over to new Parish Council email addresses too.

Our April meeting is shorter than usual as it leads into the Annual Parish Meeting. As always, everyone is welcome to attend and the APM is a chance to hear updates from a wide range of organisations and groups in the village – from the WI and Village Hall Committee to Ripon College and the Community Orchard.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 7th April and the Annual Parish Meeting begins at 8pm.

BRINGING MARKET GARDENING BACK TO GARSINGTON



There was a time when Garsington had many market gardens, supplying fresh vegetables for the village and to Oxford's markets. Like many rural communities, that close connection to small-scale food production has gradually been lost.

Our aim is to help restore it by bringing hyper-local, regenerative growing back into the heart of the community – nurturing both social connection and healthy ecosystems. This kind of farming produces seasonal, nutrient rich vegetables, without chemicals and with virtually zero food miles. It also offers an opportunity to connect with how your food is produced and what is in season.

We invite you to join us on Friday afternoons to meet neighbours, make new friends and spend some time with your hands in the soil - or simply to collect your weekly vegetable box and enjoy a cup of tea and a slice of cake.

Volunteer afternoons will begin on Fridays after Easter. A seasonal veg box subscription, with weekly pick up from the field in Southend, will start in June. Numbers for both will be limited.

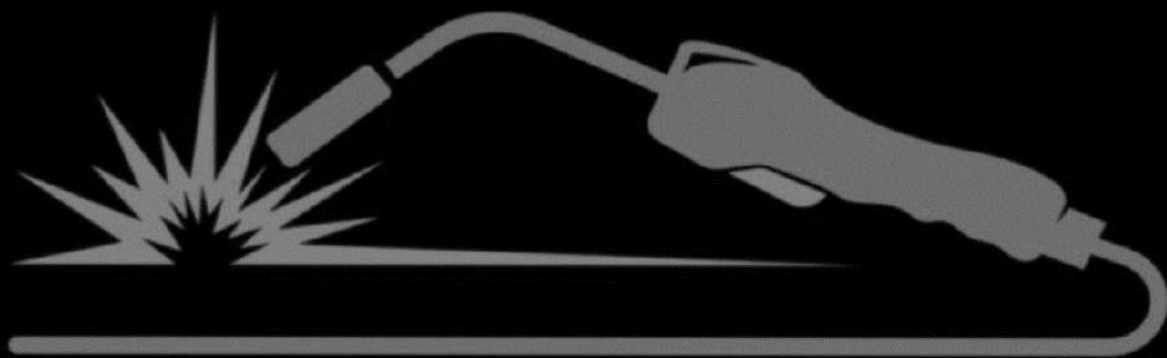
