Decision of Bramshaw Parish Council.....

Towards the Vicar's stipend, house and pension and other
central expenses. We have to raise about £30,000 p.a.
to meet our expenses and currently we are at an
annual deficit.

We are spending considerable sums this
year on renovation of the bell tower and the
church bells - one of these is of great historic
interest being one of the oldest in the country -
dating back to about 1220 A.D.

We have considerable reserves to
cover such capital expenditure but also rely
on the income from this each year.

P.C. members will be interested to know
that the church contains the First World War
memorial with the names of 70 young men from
the parish on it. (I propose to talk about
this at the Annual Assembly.)
