#### **CLLR CAROLYNE CULVER**

Dear residents

I have been pressing for a weight limit on Bury Lane for a long time now, to prevent heavy vehicles using the village as a diversion route, and I renewed my efforts after the incident in February when there was a vehicle fire on the A34. The latest response from the councillor responsible for highways is as follows,

'Officers and I are in the process of finalising the network management plan for 2025-26, subjects such as the below [ie Bury Lane] could form part of this, and I am currently in the process of finalising the priority for any schemes. As I said there is a long list of competing priorities requests being worked through'. So unfortunately I don't think we are going to be seeing any action on this for a while, if at all.

In the past I have lobbied WBC and Oxfordshire County Council to include East IIsley in the X34 bus route, thereby intersecting with route 6, but to no avail. However (assuming the local government minister agrees) WBC will be merging with Vale of White Horse and South Oxfordshire district councils in the next few years. So the existing local authority boundary between us and Harwell/Didcot will disappear. So let's lobby again! Please scroll down the link below and hit the 'Complete our survey' button. Question 5 asks for other suggestions, so that is where we can make our voices heard about the X34.


