## **Flooding and Drainage Report to Council – Meeting of 30 March 2026**

Following extreme heavy rainfall overnight 27 into 28 February 2026 Kirton experienced flooding. Drains were observed to be overwhelmed and backing up and there were high volumes of water in the ditch. Since midnight Kirton received 22mm of rainfall, equating to circa 89,000 litres of water per acre (i.e. 89 tonnes). With an approximation of 380 acres of land this equates to 33.8 million litres of rainfall in 9 hours, falling onto already saturated clay land. The impact of which is illustrated below.



The Parish Council shares residents concerns of flooding in Kirton and organised a meeting with stakeholders. The meeting, held from 3pm on Thursday 26 March was attended by:

Earlier that the day, VIA East Midlands had arranged for a camera survey to inspect the ditch running beneath the road to determine whether it was obstructed. The inspection found no blockages and there was evidence of water flow.

It was noted that the riparian ditch does not appear to have been cleared in some time, is shallow and has a volume of vegetation which requires clearing to assist future water flow away from the village.

In the UK, the responsibility for maintaining a riparian ditch lies with the riparian landowner, which is the person or party who owns land or property next to, or through which the watercourse flows. They must ensure water flows freely, removing debris, clearing blockages, and maintaining the banks and bed. VIA advised they have written to the adjoining resident of the riparian ditch with regards to the upkeep on 4 occasions since October 2024, the most recent times being August 2025 and in the last week, with no response to date. They also advised Land Registration is currently pending.

The group undertook a walk around the village. This included inspection of the riparian ditch, road gullies, walked through Kirton Park, up the footpath and to the fields beyond, enabling all parties to gain a fuller understanding of the local topography and drainage conditions of the land. During the walkabout the group spoke with several residents, including some who kindly demonstrated measures they had implemented, for example constructing a private drain to help direct rainfall away from their properties and downhill.

While waking in the village, several other non drain and flooding issues were highlighted and reported, for example tree maintenance work requests.

VIA East Midlands will ascertain the gully cleaning schedule and provide this information back to the Parish Council.

The meeting was a productive starting point and provided valuable insight for all involved. The next step is for the group to meet with the Nottinghamshire Flood Risk Team with a meeting date to be agreed in April 2026.
