From Your Parish Council

Just over a month into our new roles, the Parish Council members have found their feet and we are up and running, making progress with matters passed on like batons from the outgoing members and we are also starting to look ahead to developing new projects.

Amongst top priorities at the moment are the Pavilion driveway lights, which please be assured we are working on to get into general use as soon as possible, even though we still have long summer evenings to enjoy for a while yet. Another key issue is the playground; sadly several smaller posts have rotted through and after thorough investigation, two other pieces of equipment have been taped off as a precaution. The PC and the original playground committee are in the process of investigating solutions with the manufacturer to arrange repairs.

As residents will be well aware, Moulsford can make many claims to having a unique character. One of those claims is that the village is the home ground of two substantial independent schools - Moulsford Preparatory and Cranford House. We have now visited both schools to meet with their key representatives to find out more about their current and future plans and discuss the schools' relationships with the wider community. The PC and both schools recognise there are significant challenges in having two large schools resident in the village, so all sides are keen to engage in constructive communication to resolve issues and to explore enhancing school engagement with the village community. Both schools have some fantastic facilities, so there is great potential for the wider community to benefit from them as well. We are giving it some thought and the Events Committee are starting to work on some ideas as well. If you would like to know more, give us feedback or have some suggestions, please do get in touch.

Finally, it was reported at the last PC meeting that on 30th May an ambulance could not get along Underhill due to cars parking staggered on both sides of the road. We have raised Underhill's parking and other road issues with Oxfordshire County Council to find out what the solutions might be. In the meantime, we would like to remind all residents of our narrower lanes to please take care with parking to avoid a repeat of this situation.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My dear friends,

I am writing this in a week when on Wednesday there was a mass lobby of Parliament with regard to climate change which was attended by many church leaders including Steven Croft, our own Bishop of Oxford, and on Thursday the Glastonbury Festival was kicked off with a huge *Extinction Rebellion* march. None of us can claim to be unaware of the dangers of climate change, especially in a year when there have been massive floods in Mozambique, Zimbabwe and India and even now much of Europe is yet again roasting under temperatures of 40 – 45 degrees Celsius.

No doubt, we all agree that *something must be done* and maybe some of us have even been on protests and marches or lobbied Parliament. It is very easy to blame governments for being slow to respond, but at the end of the day they are only reflecting the desires of their electorates, which of course includes you and me. The real question is how much do *I* really care? Do I care enough to change my life-style, pay for more expensive energy, cut down on my use of the car and air-travel, cut down on all the food that is transported huge distances from across the globe, cut down on food like beef stuffs and other products like palm oil which involve the deforestation of vast tracts of land.

As a Christian, I believe that God created this universe including our beautiful planet as a finely-tuned mechanism to be our home. The Bible tells us that He has entrusted this planet into our care as wise stewards. Tragically we seem to be betraying that trust.

Living as we do in the beautiful and usually very green Thames valley, we are largely insulated from the worst effects of climate change apart from enjoying warmer summers more frequently. The danger is that we can kid ourselves that the situation is not as urgent as it really is. Sadly, it is the poorest in the world who already are being hit severely by the effects of climate-change, usually in the form of floods and hurricanes. But even if we are not moved by compassion for the poor, or the injustice of the most vulnerable suffering as a result of the greed and stubbornness of the rich, then at the very least we should face up to the fact that what the poor on the other side of the world today are suffering as a result of changing climate, will be facing us and certainly our children and grandchildren tomorrow.

Bishop Steven wrote this week in his blog: "The Bible is rich in images of hell. One such image is that of the flood waters rising bringing chaos, which will be the reality for coastal towns and cities across the world. One is a place too hot to live. This week much of Europe is preparing for a heat wave and temperatures high enough to endanger life on a massive scale. Another is of a rubbish dump. As I write this, the Guardian reports the news that the UN Special Rapporteur says our world is increasingly at risk of "climate apartheid", where the rich pay to escape heat and hunger caused by the escalating climate crisis while the rest of the world suffers. These are the futures we are bequeathing to our children."

I hope that you have a lovely and enjoyable summer, but on the hottest days, take a moment to reflect on our responsibility - as a nation and as individuals - to do all we can to change our life-style so that the effects of climate-change can be halted.

Universal Credit being used in new scam – Citizens Advice

Universal Credit has well and truly arrived - but now scammers are using the benefit as a pivotal part of a new sting to target vulnerable people.

Citizens Advice says scammers are offering loans to their victims and then using their personal banking details to apply for Universal Credit in their names.

The scam is usually carried out by telephone, so do not accept a loan if you have been contacted by cold calling. If you are contacted in this way, just hang up. In general, personal details should not be divulged on the telephone or in an email.

The Universal Credit scam is also being carried out in public places. As victims leave job centres and pubs, they are approached by smartly dressed people claiming to be from the Department of Work and Pensions, who then offer "government loans". Instead, the victim is signed up for Universal Credit. The scammers then apply for an advance payment of the benefit. This payment goes to the victim's bank account but the scammers then charge a huge fee, around 50 per cent, for this unnecessary "service".

Citizens Advice has its own free service to help those applying for Universal Credit for the first time. "Help to Claim" is available over the telephone, face to face, and online through "webchat" and Internet content.

The national Freephone number for Help to Claim is **0800 144 8444.** Telephone and webchat services are available from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. (Monday-Friday)

Tom turns back the clock at Moulsford Prep School



Tom Williams returned to Moulsford Prep School recently – although it wasn't to hand in an overdue assignment, but as an outstanding role model to the students in his old Design Technology class.

Tom, as all of you who attended his wonderful solo Rally Talk in the Pavilion, is representing Britain – and in particularly Moulsford – in the FIA Junior World Rally Championship. That in itself is an extraordinary achievement, given that he only started rallying four years ago. Yet his willingness to learn, the dedication required to prepare physically and mentally for long gruelling events and his attention to detail in working on a pace note system and practice changing a broken wheel in less than a minute has seen him quickly rise up rallying's ladder in record time. The

hard work is already paying off, as he is established as Britain's biggest future rally talents.

And his skill behind the steering wheel and charm and cheeky grin in front of camera hasn't gone unnoticed. Tom is already a member of the works M-Sport Ford team, an Extreme Sports ambassador, supported by the RAF Reserves and has his foot on the Red Bull ladder. That alone gives him a social media audience in excess of 50 million people. And then there is the World Rally Championship audience, with its 1.6 billion on-line impressions per year and 700 hours of television broadcast in 155 territories.

It is no surprise therefore that Tom's visit to Moulsford Pre School was covered by BBC Oxford, with presenter Angie Walker filming it for the early evening news and recording it for BBC Radio Oxford.

Hosted by the school's Sarah Beardmore-Gray, the Design Technology class was a great place to film, where project head Jess Roberts – one of Tom's former teachers – and the current students showed BBC Oxford around the Goblin kit cars that it builds. Tom wasn't the only racing driver in the room, as he met Leo Robinson – who has been competing in the European Karting Championships, and is going to the World Championships in the summer. It came as a surprise to 20-year old Tom that 10-year old Leo had actually been competing one year longer than he had!

Several of the pupils were interviewed and it was great coverage for the school and the village when the feature was broadcast on BBC Oxford that evening.

"It was lovely to go back to Moulsford Prep School and have a look around – it brought back so many good and happy memories," said Tom.

"It was great to talk to the pupils, and it was really nice to see that they all support their local village driver in the World Rally Championship – and I hope I was able to inspire them.

"I've had a good start to the series, which strong performances in Sweden, Corsica and Sardinia. There are two more rounds of the Junior series to go, in Finland and our home Rally GB event, and we are aiming to move up into the next level of car as soon as possible. Competing in a Fiesta R5 will need an extra bit of backing, and when I'm not driving in a rally I am putting bespoke commercial packages together and talking to potential sponsors. It's the

business side of the sport which people don't see, and that is why starting my education at Moulsford Prep School has given me the potential to be both a good sports and businessman."


