There are 7 declared candidates running for 5 Parish Council positions. 3 of the current councillors are running for re-election and 4 additional parishioners are running. All of these candidates have been asked by the Malherbe Monthly Magazine to write a short piece about themselves so that voters are informed as to who these candidates are and what they offer the Parish Council. The below articles are in candidate alphabetic order and are exactly as sent to the editor. If a candidate has declined to write an article then that candidates name will appear only.

### **Ron Galton**



As you may know I was elected to the Boughton Malherbe Parish Council four years ago during which time I have served as Vice Chairman and made many new friends.

I can honestly say it has been an interesting, rewarding and sometimes frustrating experience, but I hope my contribution has helped to make us a more effective Parish and that those of you who requested my assistance found my efforts on your behalf to be worthwhile

The elections are almost upon us again and I would very much appreciate your vote on the third of May so that I can continue to serve as a Parish Councillor on your behalf.

### **Robert Turner**

My name is Robert Turner and I am asking for your support in the forthcoming elections for Boughton Malherbe Parish Council on May 3rd.

I have lived in the Parish for more than thirty five years during which I have served on the Parish Council for many years and have held the role as Chairman for the past four years, in fact it was only when I retired that I have been able to give more time and energy that I personally consider is necessary to undertake this role.

With the increased demands of the Borough Council, the Localism Act, reduction in Budget support and the requirement for increased input, the demands upon ones time will grow rather than reduce. I believe in Boughton Malherbe and as such want to keep it as a village where parishioners can enjoy a quality of life. As such I am part of the Speedwatch team which attempts to reduce the speed of traffic through our village - which in many cases is unacceptable and dangerous. In addition to this I represent the community as part of the Joint Parishes Group which has been

contesting parts of the Maidstone Core Strategy. This proposed Strategy Document in its current form does very little for our Parish.

I have also served on the Village Hall committee for numerous years and currently hold the role of Treasurer.

My view of the future for the Parish Council, acting on behalf of the Parish, is that we will have to "fight our corner" to protect our village from the expansion of the new Rural Service Centres of Headcorn, Lenham and Harrietsham. The extra road traffic alone that this could generate from both cars and trucks is worrying. We must create a Parish plan to assess what the people of both Grafty Green and the rest of the Parish want for the future, which will of course involve both the Parish Council and parishioners. The protection of the rural nature of the parish - especially the Greensand Way - features highly on my agenda.

Finally, if our Parish is to survive we must become more involved in Borough-wide Committees, we cannot afford to "bury our heads in the sand" if we want to be in control of our own future.

I do hope that I can count on your support on the 3rd May - Thank-you

### **Grafty Gourmet**

This is another fantastic yet very simple dish. An absolute must for chicken lovers. Chicken breasts can be use in place of thighs, if cut into 2 or 3 pieces. However, the flavour of the dark meat of the thigh, favourably compliment the chorizo sausage. A mouth watering dish by any standards.

### **Spanish Chicken with Chorizo - Serves 2**

1 red onions, cut into slices 2 cloves garlic, chopped 1 Traditional Chorizo Sausage, skin removed and cut into chunks 2 tsp Paprika 4 Chicken Thighs
1 tbsp olive oil
½ pack of vine tomatoes, cut into halves

- 1. Heat the oven to 200°C, Whilst oven is warming, fry the onion, garlic and chunks of chorizo in a large frying pan. Stir in the smoked paprika and fry until the onion is soft..
- 2. Place the chicken in the frying pan and cook with the onion, garlic and chorizo until the chicken has turned white all over.
- 3. Remove the chicken and chorizo mixture from the frying pan and place in an oven proof dish and cook for 20 minutes.
- 4. After 20 minutes, add the tomatoes to the dish and cook for a further 20 minutes. Serve with either rice or a selection of season vegetables.



# What is SKYPE? 3 Steps to free calls on your PC to anywhere in the world

Using Skype you can talk to anyone in the world and see them on your computer at no additional cost to your broadband package.



If you have family and friends who do not live close and you both have access to the internet this is the cheapest and best way to keep in touch. It's also very handy if you are unable to get out of the house (you are sick or snowed in for example) and you would like to see your family or friends who are not so far away.

### What do you need?

- 1. **Webcam and Microphone** if you have not got these already with the computer you can buy them for less than £10 each.
- 2. **Skype** type Skype into the address line on the Internet. This will take you to the Skype Website where you will see an option to GET SKYPE (make sure you get the correct version for your computer eq: windows)

You will then see an option to DOWNLOAD Skype for free, don't worry about references to pricing, as you only have to pay for special features, which you can explore and decided about later. The simple straight forward version is FREE.

# Making people happy is what we do best



### The May Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Aries at beginning of May, and moves into Taurus on the 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Full Moon** occurs on Sunday  $6^{th}$  May, when it is in the constellation of Libra, and **New Moon** is on Sunday  $20^{th}$  May.

**Mercury** is at superior conjunction (behind the Sun) at the end of May, so we are unlikely to see this elusive little planet this month.

**Venus** is beginning to fade as the brilliant "Evening Star" At the start of May it is high in the western sky just after sunset, and doesn't set until after midnight. **Venus** is still very bright, and relative to the stars is moving eastwards across Taurus.

**Mars** is high in the south-western sky at dusk, and doesn't set in the west until just before sunrise. Relative to the stars it is moving steadily south-eastwards in the constellation of Leo. Through a telescope it may be possible to see the dark and light patches on the surface, together with the white North Polar Cap.

**Jupiter** is in conjunction (with the Sun) on 13<sup>th</sup> May, which means that it rises and sets with the Sun. So it will not be possible to see the planet this month.

**Saturn** is on the opposite side of the sky to Jupiter. It is high in the southern sky at dusk, and sets in the west just before sunrise, and is moving slowly north-westwards in the constellation of Virgo. Throughout May it is still well placed for viewing. Through a telescope you should be able to see the famous rings together with many of its moons.

You may have read recently that there may be billions of potentially habitable planets in our own galaxy, the Milky Way. Researchers from Grenoble University have discovered that our galaxy may be the home of at least 100 super-earths. These are rocky planets, about the same size as our Earth, which are orbiting the "habitable zone" of red dwarfs. (A red dwarf is a small and relatively cool star, which is common in the galaxy). These rocky planets, which would have distances of less than 30 light years away, may have liquid surface water, which is an essential ingredient of life. Communication, however, would still be a problem, as it would take 30 years to get a message to them, and another 30 years waiting for a reply!

### **Christian Message May 2012**

By the time this is published Fabrice Muamba will almost certainly not be news. He is the Bolton Wanderers footballer who hit the news when he suffered a cardiac arrest in an FA quarter-final match in March. Despite his heart stopping for 78 minutes (yes, seventy-eight minutes) he lived. As I write this, the latest reports are that his recovery is progressing beyond all expectations and he is walking around his room. Maybe by the time you're reading, he's back on the field.

What also made the news was that Fabrice is a Christian whose family are also believers and are not afraid to say so. Nor were they afraid to suggest that prayer would make a difference, so they publicly asked for prayer for Fabrice. And what is interesting is that people responded. People prayed; the newspapers were full of it for a day or two – the SUN had this headline: "Praying for Muamba: GOD IS IN CONTROL"

Several questions come out of this. Why single out Fabrice Muamba to pray for, when there are so many others in similar situations? Why are we surprised when people ask for prayer? Why surprised that people respond? And why surprised that God hears and answers?

While many people in the UK call themselves Christians, very few know what it really means to be a follower of Jesus (which is what a Christian is and does). Yet in a crisis, most people do pray, as the "Muamba Moment", and all the opinion polls, tell us. Jesus tells us to pray to Father God and gave us the Lord's Prayer; St. Paul says "don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done." (Philippians 4:6)

Let's be a bit less shy about prayer! A small group already meet in each church in the area to pray for our community for 30 minutes once a week at 9.30. Anyone can join us and we'd love to see you! Harrietsham on Mondays, Boughton Malherbe and Ulcombe (alternating) on Tuesdays, and Lenham on Wednesdays.

If you can't come and join us, put your prayer request on a slip of paper and leave it at church – and we will pray for you. Or phone the vicar (858195) or the church office (850604) to ask for prayer. Did you know that in Harrietsham and Lenham churches, you can light a candle and quietly say a prayer? Come in and try!

We know, like Muamba, that God hears our prayers – Psalm 107 verse 6 says "You were in serious trouble, but you prayed to the Lord and he rescued you." Do it!
