FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

Dear Parishioners,

At the Parish Council Meeting at the beginning of May I was elected as Chair for the coming year. I step with some trepidation into the shoes of Chris Luke who has performed this role with distinction for the last eleven years. He leaves large shoes to fill and the Parish owes a great debt of gratitude to him for the immense amount of work he has done over this period.

My first task was to chair the Annual Parish Meeting where we heard updates about village activities from a dozen different people, including Harriet Harris, the new Principal of the College. It was also something of a baptism of fire for our fairly new Parish Clerk, Jo Garvey, who is making sure Parish Council business goes smoothly.

One thing that came out of the meeting, which we will be looking at in the months ahead, is how the Neighbourhood Watch scheme for the village can be updated. The original model for this grew up long before widespread use of email, messaging apps and social media, which today provide more effective methods of disseminating information rather than by a series of phone contacts. However each of these alternative communication channels only reaches a portion of the village, so we need to think how we can achieve good coverage while limiting the demands on individual Neighbourhood Watch coordinators.

New regulations relating to local government data management have made us change the way that the Council deals with emails. On the inside back page you will find that the email address for the Parish Council Clerk is now clerk@cuddesdondenton-pc.gov.uk and all councillors now have addresses of the same form.

Finally, a few words to record appreciation for all the work put in by those who organised the very successful fete on 9th May. The weather could not have been better and the whole event was, once again, a great success.

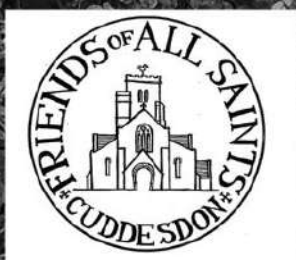

FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends

I'd like to begin by saying a huge thank you to all from Cuddesdon and Denton who supported the fete on 9th May. Especial thanks to those who helped set up on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning, erecting the marquee, gazebos, tables, slippery pole and stalls etc; and to those who helped dismantle everything and tidy up after the fete on Saturday. I know it is physically demanding and tiring work.

Thank you, too, to all who helped on the day; to all the Cuddesdon Fete Committee; and to the Revd Dr Harriet Harris and all at Ripon College Cuddesdon. We could not hold the fete without the support of the village and College. Thank you. Early indications suggest that the fete was very successful, though I have not yet seen the final figure raised.

In my last 'from the Vicar', we had just begin celebrating Easter, and I included the E.E Cummings poem, 'I thank You God for most this amazing day', which captures much of the joy and hope of Easter, Resurrection and re-creation or rebirth.

As I write this, we're heading towards the end of the Easter season. I'm currently looking forward to Ascension Day (Thursday 14th May) and to Pentecost (or Whit Sunday, 24th May). By the time you read this Easter will be over and we'll be celebrating Trinity Sunday, then the long season of 'Sundays after Trinity', or 'Ordinary Time'.

Ascension Day (40 days after Easter) marks the end of Jesus' post-resurrection ministry with (and appearances to) his disciples. It represents the day on which Jesus was taken up into heaven, to assume his throne there. It is followed, ten days later, by Pentecost or Whitsun, when the promised Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus' disciples and filled them with power from on high. This wasn't just a 'one-off' occurrence. The Holy Spirit didn't descend at Pentecost and then disappear. Almost 2,000 years later, the Holy Spirit is still active in the church and – I believe – in the world, today. Jesus promised his disciples that the Holy Spirit would be with us for ever, and would abide with us and be in us. And we can still experience the power of the Holy Spirit today.

Some people experience the Holy Spirit in worship. John Wesley famously experienced the Holy Spirit at a religious meeting on Aldersgate Street, London, on 24th May 1738, and described how he felt his 'heart strangely warmed', as his doubts disappeared. This event is considered to be the defining moment of the evangelical revival, and the spark for the Methodist movement.

Other people experience the Holy Spirit as a 'still, small voice', which brings a sense of peace, even in difficult times. Others again receive charismatic gifts including speaking in tongues; resting in the Spirit; gifts of healing; or the reception of words, images, pictures or visions from God.

Every year, at the end of April, I attend a charismatic catholic conference called On Fire Mission, where I see, feel and hear the Holy Spirit powerfully at work. My encounter with the Holy Spirit encourages, comforts, energises, strengthens and inspires me – just as the first disciples were encouraged, energised, strengthened and inspired on the first Day of Pentecost.

This year, at On Fire Mission, one of the key-note speakers unsettled us with his talk 'The Holy Spirit is not your friend', reminding us that the Holy Spirit can disturb and challenge us, and turn our lives upside down. He (or, perhaps, she, or they) blows where he will. As C S Lewis once said of Aslan, 'He is not a tame lion'. Neither Aslan nor the Holy Spirit can be controlled by human beings. They are wild, unpredictable, and not safe, 'yet entirely good'.

I wonder where you have seen, or felt, the Holy Spirit at work in your life, or in the lives of others? I wonder what the Holy Spirit might be saying to you, today? I wonder what that phrase 'the Holy Spirit is not your friend' means to you, personally?

I pray that the Holy Spirit might comfort, strengthen, equip and empower you; and that your heart might be 'strangely warmed' as John Wesley's was, almost 300 years ago.

What can I book? Parties, pop-ups, classes, workshops, memorials, wakes, markets, coffee mornings, parent groups, games nights...you name it! Unless it is dangerous or politically divisive, you can (probably) hold it in our hall.

How much does it cost? £12.50 per hour

Capacity: up to 150 for a standing event, 100 seated theatre-style, 80 if seated around tables.

Facilities: tables and chairs, domestic kitchen, crockery, cutlery and tea service for 30-40 people, hot water urn, children's toys, access to community play park, projector, speakers.

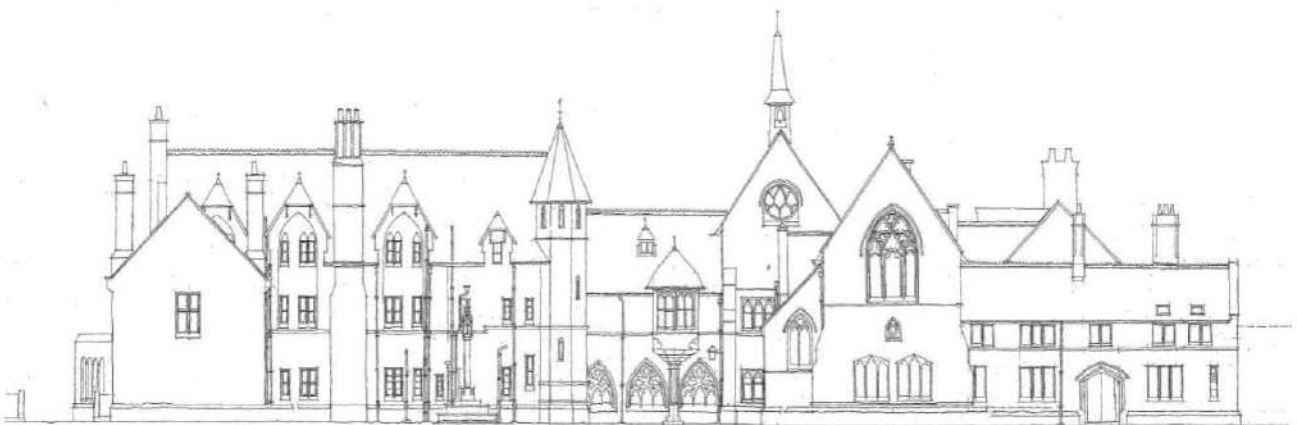
