

**HIGH HALDEN PARISH COUNCIL**  
**Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting**  
**held on Wednesday 13 May 2025 at 7pm in the Memorial Hall**

**12/26 Election of Chairman and to receive a signed Declaration of Acceptance of Office**

Cllr. Hoath was proposed by Cllr. Sargent and seconded by Cllr. Morgan. Cllr. Hoath accepted the nomination and there were no other nominations.

**Resolved: Cllr. Hoath was elected as Chairman following a unanimous vote. Subsequent to the meeting Cllr. Hoath signed a declaration of acceptance of office.**

**13/26 Present and Apologies**

**14/26 Election of Vice Chairman and to receive a signed Declaration of Acceptance of Office**

Cllr. Pearson was proposed by Cllr. Hoath and seconded by Cllr. Morgan. Cllr. Pearson accepted the nomination and there were no other nominations.

**Resolved: Cllr. Pearson was elected as Vice Chairman following a unanimous vote. Subsequent to the meeting Cllr. Pearson signed a declaration of acceptance of office.**

**15/26 Administration:** Fire Exits, Fire Meeting Point, Mobile Phones. The Clerk confirmed that there had been no requests to record the meeting.

**16/26 Declaration of Interest:** None.

**17/26 Appointment and Scope of Internal Auditor**

The Clerk advised that the internal audit function must be sufficiently independent from the management of financial controls and procedures of the Parish Council. The person carrying out internal audit must be competent to carry out the role in a way that meets the business needs of the Parish Council. The internal auditor must not have any involvement in the financial decision making, management or control of the Parish Council, or with the Council's financial controls and procedures. The Clerk advised that Mr Lionel Robbins is willing to continue to act as the Internal Auditor for the Parish Council. The date set for the Clerk and Mr Robbins to meet is 2nd June 2026.

**Resolved: To appoint Mr. Lionel Robbins as the internal auditor.**

**18/26 Eligibility to use the General Power of Competence**

The Clerk advised that the Parish Council does not meet the eligibility criteria for the General Power of Competence adopted at its meeting held on the 18 May 2023 due to the number of unelected Councillors. The Clerk advised that the power is lost until the next Parish Council election.

#### **21/26 Minutes of the meeting held on the 13 April 2026**

**Resolved: That the Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 13 April 2026 be approved and confirmed as a true record.**

#### **22/26 Report from the Clerk (information purposes only):**

The Clerk reported that Cllr. Wayne Chapman, County Councillor had sent a report for May 2026. A copy of the report had been placed on the website.

#### **23/26 Ward Member Report:**

Ward Cllr. Alan Pickering had sent his apologies and there was nothing to report.

#### **24/26 Open Session:**

A member of the public queried the status of the planning application for Hatchentan which has been approved. The Chairman gave an update noting that a copy of an injunction relating to the site had been requested by the Parish Council in October 2025 but this had only been recently provided. This delay seriously impeded the Parish Council's response to Ashford Borough Council's ("**ABC**") Planning Department, regarding the retrospective planning application. The Parish Council will be submitting a follow-up letter to Simon Cole.

A member of the public queried if the Parish Council would be taking any action on the stationing of mobile homes on the Field West of Old Place Cottage. The Parish Council will be responding to the Planning Officer's Report and the Chairman will be representing the Parish Council at the Planning Committee Meeting on 20 May.

A member of the public queried the planning application for permission in principle to build nine dwellings on the land between Bourne House and Summerhill Cottages. This matter would be discussed by the Parish Council later in the meeting.

#### **25/26 Parish Council Vacancy:**

The Chair requested, and it was agreed, that this item be deferred to be discussed under Confidential Items.

#### **26/26 Highway Matters**

##### **Annual Review of the Highways Improvement Plan ("HIP").**

It was agreed that a zoom meeting should be arranged by the Clerk with the members of the Parish Council to discuss the HIP.

#### **27/26 Local issues**

##### **a) The sale of High Halden station**

The owners at Sportsman wished to purchase the site with the intention of upgrading it for local businesses and to establish a tea-room. They were advised that the site now sits within the parish of Biddenden.

##### **b) Felling of Oak tree, 8 The Chennels**

The Clerk commented that he had contacted ABC to ascertain if they had provided the necessary permission for the felling of the oak but at the time of the meeting confirmation had not been received.

**c) Hope House hedge and verge**

The Clerk noted that Kent Highways had been contacted to arrange for the hedge and verge to be cut as the overgrown hedge was causing an obstruction to the residents at Hope House.

**d) Litter Reporting**

The Chair requested that any requests for litter removal should be reported to the Clerk to follow up with ABC. Alternatively, members of the public could use the app Fix My Street. Cllr. Morgan reported that the Litter Pick which had taken place on the 4<sup>th</sup> May Bank Holiday had been successful and she thanked all the volunteers and The Chequers on the Green for their hospitality.

**e) Allotments – water access/usage and water meter**

A tenant had asked if hose pipes could be used to water the allotments. However, the Tenancy Agreement states that the use of hose pipes is not permitted, frequent hose pipe bans made provision (and monitoring) difficult and they should make efforts to collect rainwater. Cllr. Sargent agreed to speak to Terry Haigh about the provision of water going forward.

**f) Stall at High Halden Summer Fayre**

The Parish Council will have a stall at the Summer Fayre and that leaflets and information will be provided on a variety of issues including Neighbourhood Watch, Speedwatch, the MUGA, the allotments and the adoption of trees in the orchard. There would also be details of the sites within the parish which had been allocated for development in the 2042 Plan.

**28/26 Community Warden/Kent Police/Anti-Social Behaviour**

There were no specific items to report.

The police are looking to reinvigorate Neighbourhood Watch in the local parishes and it was agreed that consideration should be made as to how this could be arranged within High Halden

There was a discussion on Community Speedwatch and it was noted that many vehicles were being driven too fast through the village. Various measures had been considered but these had not been able to be implemented including the extension of 30mph through the village. There were concerns that Speedwatch was not effective and we do not have sufficient volunteers to run the scheme at present.

The Coffee Morning on the 5<sup>th</sup> June will be attended by PC Aaron Hobday (all being well) to discuss any community issues.

**29/26 Review of Section 106 and Future Projects**

Members agreed that it would be helpful for the Parish Council to meet informally on Zoom with the Clerk to run through such items as the S.106 allocation and future projects including the provision for young people and to obtain an update of grass pitch funding.

**30/26 Assets of Community Value and Parish Property**

The Clerk agreed to follow up on the status of the applications for Assets of Community Value status for St Mary's The Virgin Church, the War Memorial Hall, The Chequers on the Green and the Cricket Field and to arrange for Bournes to carry out the remaining work on the adult football pitch.

Cllr. Morgan highlighted that the bus shelters were not cleaned to a satisfactory standard. It was agreed that the Clerk would investigate the matter with Mint Fresh to confirm when they had last attended.

**31/26 Christmas Tree Arrangements**

The Village Christmas tree last year was very kindly paid for by Terry Haigh. The Parish Council will look into finding a willing contributor for this year's tree.

**32/26 Planning****PLANNING APPLICATIONS****PA/2026/0629-31: Tenterden Business Centre, Ashford Road**

Variation of Condition 12 of planning permission 22/00605/AS to replace the approved application 19/01525/AS with a new unit to provide ancillary space and services. **Resolved: Support.**

**OTH/2026/0721: 1 Durrant Green, Ashford Road**

Biodiversity Enhancement Plan and condition 9 (Construction Ecological Management Plan for planning permission PA/2025/1580. **Resolved: No comment.**

**PA/2026/0757: Land between Bourne House and Summerhill Cottages, Ashford Road**

Permission in principle for the erection of nine dwellings.

The Chairman asked Cllr. Sargent to provide some background to the application. Cllr. Sargent reported that the site had been subject of a planning application for twenty-eight houses in 2021 which had received over sixty objections. At that time the Parish Council had maintained that the development represented exceptional and unplanned growth on one of the last remaining green spaces on the road to Tenterden and it would put pressure on the community's infrastructure. The application was refused following the planning officer's recommendation and the matter was appealed by the developer. The appeal was refused on the basis that the development was disproportionate to the local community and was not considered to be sustainable as there was no access to shopping facilities and local services.

It was agreed that an objection should be drafted by Cllr. Sargent for submission by 20 May 2026 for ratification at the next Parish Council meeting. The Clerk was requested to contact Ward Cllr. Alan Pickering to 'call in' the application if ABC were minded to approve the application. **Resolved: Object.**

### **Other Planning Matters**

#### **Hatchentan, Land south-east of Hatchentan, Plurenden Road, High Halden**

A letter had been drafted to Simon Cole, Assistant Director Planning and Development at ABC and had been approved following circulation to the members of the Parish Council. The letter had been written following a review of the 2018 Injunction Order and other matters including governance concerns in relation to the approval of planning permission for the site. This would be ratified by the Parish Council later in the meeting and circulated to Terry Mortimer, Monitoring Officer and Ward Cllr. Alan Pickering.

The Chair noted that a further letter would be prepared which would also be sent to Simon Cole and copied to Terry Mortimer and Ward Cllr. Alan Pickering requesting Bank Holiday cover by the Enforcement team for the late May and August Bank Holidays.

#### **ENF/2025/0310: Field West of Old Place Cottage known as Oak Tree Field, Woodchurch Road, High Halden**

The Chairman reported that a detailed written response would be prepared and sent to the Planning Officer, Matthew Apperley and copied to Simon Cole ahead of the Planning Committee meeting to be held on 20 May 2026 and the Chairman would present a case of objection at the meeting.

**Resolved: To approve that Jubilee fields be offered to Mr. Dodd and that this would be reviewed again at the next PC meeting.**

The Clerk reminded Members that not all of the agreed drainage works had taken place to the football pitch last year so the Parish Council had only spent £1,850.00 of the £3,150.00 granted. It was noted that ABC had confirmed in writing that the remaining funds could be spent on the improvements to the drainage on the football pitches within two years of the date of the funding agreement (19th June 2025) and ABC had therefore agreed for HHPC to carry any remaining funds over to the next financial year, as long as they are spent by June 2027.
