Continuing support for Covid-19 Community Groups

Since March we've been working with over 100 community groups who are supporting vulnerable and isolated people in their communities through shopping, collecting prescriptions and befriending. Our team worked tirelessly and thanks to a lot of help from local Churches, Councils, the Lions Club and some amazing individuals we've been able to find or help establish groups in all locations where we have branches. Looking to the future...

We're teaming up with YMCA Lincolnshire to support their Good Neighbours Scheme.

After talking to the community groups it's become clear that many of them would like to continue to support lonely and vulnerable people in their communities long after lockdown and Covid-19. They're keen to keep the amazing bonds they've made with their neighbours. YMCA Lincolnshire have the perfect solution with the Good Neighbour Schemes which are run by local volunteers for local people who may need help on an occasional or regular basis. Lincolnshire Co-op's Community team will be supporting the YMCA's team with the development and setting up of schemes across the county for any groups who are interested. Support for Mental Health and Domestic Abuse



Covid-19 has resulted in some charities and causes seeing an increase in demand for their services – Domestic Abuse and Mental Health are unfortunately two of these.

Each quarter we change the charities that we support through our Community Champions scheme and from June-September we're supporting 11 local Domestic Abuse and Mental Health charities, in response to the current situation. Our members and colleagues will be fundraising through shopping (with their dividend card), collection boxes and the carrier bag levy. In addition to fundraising the charities are working with us to campaign their key messages about how people can access support. Support for Foodbanks



Foodbanks are really under pressure at the moment and unfortunately it's likely that the high level of demand will continue long into the future. We're working closely with 30 local Foodbanks by housing collection points in our stores, donating goods and acting as a link with national charity FareShare.

Free School Meal Vouchers





After schools closed, they were faced with having to still provide food for those eligible for Free School Meals. Whilst many schools are able to use the national voucher scheme which works with the major supermarkets, this isn't an option for many rural schools. We've been working with over 50 schools to run a bespoke voucher scheme to ensure that all pupils can access food locally during this time.
