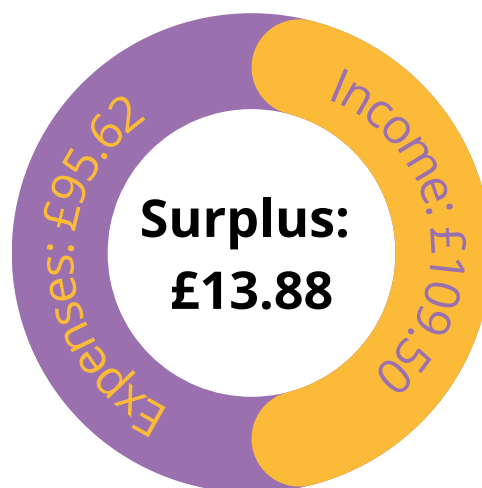

What's on Next Month?



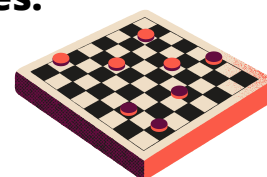
Free play - unstructured activities led by the young people themselves.
