Neighbourhood Plans

Give communities (towns, parishes, neighbourhood forums) direct **power to:**

- develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood
- shape the development/growth of their local area
- produce a plan with real legal weight that directs development in a local area.

Help communities:

- influence the type of development
- choose where new homes, shops and offices should be built and shape what those new buildings should look like.
- ✓ Must deal with development and the use of land.
- ✓ Must be in general conformity with the strategic policies of the Local Plan - should not promote less development than set out in the Local Plan.
















How Neighbourhood Plans can be Successful in Adding Value

Communities can:


- ✓ utilise their local knowledge to










Enables communities to address local needs (local housing needs, need for recreation space, need for employment facilities).





More CIL money is available to the community when a neighbourhood plan is in place.



It can help to **bring communities together** to help build a **better relationship** between the district and parishes.







Support available



- Financial
- Groups are able to obtain financial support from central Government.
- This usually covers the preparation costs of most neighbourhood plans.

District Council

- Advice and guidance throughout the process.
- A named **lead officer** offering support.
- Advice on government grant funding and technical support available.
- Advice on community engagement.
- Guidance of statutory requirements and policy.



Examination/Referendum

 The district council covers the cost of examination and referendum.




