

## Dear Friends,

Autumn is well and truly here. It doesn't feel like long ago when we were bracing ourselves for a heatwave; the warm air clinging to our faces as we ventured outside and sought shade under thick canopies of leaves. 



# LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR NOVEMBER

November seems to be the month for remembering.

All Souls at the beginning of the month is a chance to remember with thankfulness those whom we have loved but see no more.

And, of course, there is also our national act of Remembrance, on Remembrance Sunday. As the daughter of a man who served in the Royal Navy during the Second World War and the Korean War, I never fail to be moved as the poppies fall down from the roof of the Royal Albert Hall during the Festival of Remembrance. That remembrance is all the more poignant in our own day as the reality of war and its human cost is once again apparent. There will be services at war memorials and in churches across the diocese as we remember those who died fighting to protect us and bring peace and justice to our world, and we pray for those serving in our Armed Forces today.

Memories, and remembering, are such central parts of our personalities and character, and in many ways make up part of who we are. Being remembered is very important to us, and the thought that we might be forgotten can be heart-breaking. I often read these verses from Isaiah to people who are feeling lost and abandoned for any reason, or who are grieving the passing of years which means that all those whom they knew and loved, and who held the memories of them as younger people, have died:

God says, "Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands." (Isaiah 49:15-16a)

For Christians, of course, the most significant act of remembering is when we come together to remember in bread and wine the death and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus' willing sacrifice of himself on the cross for the sake of others is, for Christian believers, the ultimate expression of the self-giving love at the heart of God, when Christ's hands were marked by the nails of the cross.

"Do this in remembrance of me."

So in this season of Remembrance, as we remember with candles, poppies, or bread and wine, may we all take time to pause, reflect, and be thankful.





# Spotlight on Nant Valley

Since We moved to Nant Valley about 18 months ago we have been busy with our biodiversity woodland project and thought you might like to hear what we have been up to.

Nant Valley is 9 acres of mainly woodland nestled below Middle Hill and North Hill and adjoining Wondrell Coppice. We are in the parish of Cardington on its southern-most border.

Over the last 18 months we have been developing our plans for managing the land to maximise its biodiversity potential. With climate change in mind we want to provide as diverse habitats as possible and increase the bio resilience of the site.

Our first job has been to start our bracken management regime. This involves raking up the old thatch and strimming the site several times a season. We are already seeing benefits of a more diverse flora, wood sage, foxgloves and wild basil, more bees and insect pollinators and the bluebells this spring were magnificent. Of course the bracken will be back next year but we have already seen a reduction in its vigour.

So far we have planted over 500 trees, all native English species, a balance of Shropshire wet woodland: alder, elm, birch, willow, hazel, hawthorn as well as widening the species mixes to include aspens, poplars, white beam, service tree and Scot's pine. We have planted a hedgerow up the western boundary and even one of the queens commemorative jubilee trees. We have doubled the number of native trees and shrubs from 20 to 40 species.

The old pond was very silted and dried up in the first summer so with the expert help of our neighbour we dredged and extended the pond. Although the water levels dropped a lot we have had water in it all summer despite the drought and it's been a haven for the insects, birds and bats as well as rabbits and the occasional roe deer, and our first brood of ducklings. The stream through the site feeds the pond and the remainder flows down to the Gutter. In the absence of beavers we have started to create a series of leaky dams to create more of a wetland habit in the upper end of the valley.

Alongside the pond we have created a wild flower meadow, sowing rattle and a mix of native flower seeds. Its first season saw several new species become established. It is definitely work in progress and we hope to spread more seed this autumn now we can see it is taking off.



Andrew has built up his knowledge of the night life with his moth traps, he has identified over 500 species including 5 of which are nationally scarce.



Our first clutch of mason bees seem to have taken to their new home and we will be monitoring their progress. Our first 10 bird boxes are up with more planned - as well as bat boxes and perhaps dormice boxes going forwards. We will be surveying their use with interest.

Most of all it's been an opportunity to learn and all that strimming certainly keeps us fit. The site never fails to delight and

surprise. As I write this article we have just seen our first Kingfisher by the pond. We are beyond excited.

## Shirley's SHCT sponsored bike ride 2022

The second Sunday of September is always the date of the R&S, but sadly this year the death of the Queen forced a change out of respect, and it was postponed to 24<sup>th</sup> September. Along with others across the country I was unable to change the date of my ride due to prior commitments, and so cycled as planned on the 10<sup>th</sup>.



My first call at Hughley was reached along the flat roads through Longville and Butcher's Barn, instead of just indulging myself with a ride along Wenlock Edge to drop down Hughley Bank, and then to St. John the Baptist's church. Part of the Much Wenlock benefice, it has now become one of those churches known as 'Festival churches' – that is to say services are infrequent, once a month here, and often only at festivals: Christmas, Easter, Harvest and so on I suppose.

What a relief it must have been when the village of Harley was spared constant traffic and was by-passed, the A458 being now only a distant presence, and allowing residents and visitors peace to enjoy the wonderful views of Wenlock Edge and of the Wrekin.

Harley has a unique status in the whole of Shropshire, and a significant role nationally too, being one of only 60 villages of the 16,000 or so in the entire country that sent young men away to fight in the first World War and gratefully received every one of them home: the '*Thankful Villages*'. The title was coined by Arthur Mee, he of the childrens' encyclopaedias; those twenty men are commemorated on a plaque inside the church, and of course there is no war memorial. Considering the immense loss of life both nationally and worldwide, Harley must have been a thankful village indeed.



Off again, passing the strange little restored C18th pound for stray animals, and on along the A458 to Christchurch, Cressage. This is the second church in Cressage, (the

medieval one was at the west end of the village), and was named for the Curate's college at Cambridge. Having raised the funds for a more centrally situated building I suppose he felt he had the right to alter the dedication – but I would have liked 'St. Sampson's' more! Sadly it has every appearance of no longer being used.

Leaving the main road a wandering route was followed gently uphill towards my next stop, passing through Harnage, to Cound. St. Peter's church had associations with the Abbey in Shrewsbury, dates from the C13th, and prepandemic hosted many successful annual 'Come and Sing' days, when a prominent musician or teacher would take his charges through learning, rehearsing and finally performing a piece of music – all in one day! Often challenging but always very enjoyable.....I hope they can be reinstated when COVID19 is a memory.

The strangely named Cound Stank came very soon after leaving the village, but has nothing to do with agricultural smells: the word is actually derived from the Old French word estanc, present-day French *étang* - a pond or lake, and a reminder of 1066 and all that. After this driest of summers there was no sign of even a puddle, despite recent heavy rain showers

Next, on towards Pitchford, along part of Watling Street, the old Roman road which is now little more than a track in places but once led directly to Viroconium, across the Severn, now under the care of English Heritage. Also watched over by them is Cantlop Bridge – a nice little detour on the way to Condover. While he was Shropshire county surveyor Thomas Telford oversaw the expansion and improvement of communications in the county and Cantlop Bridge was a part of the scheme. Like Ironbridge it is of cast iron but unlike it does not mimic a wooden bridge; it is elegant, lightly framed and one of the only two remaining cast iron Telford bridges still in situ, and now closed to traffic to preserve it.



So we arrived at Condover, St. Andrew and St. Mary's. (I say we because my son Toby once again came from London to cycle with me on this sponsored ride and we en-

joyed having a day together.) The Domesday book of 1086 recorded a church already in existence at Condover, and the area was much favoured for hunting by generations following the conquest. It also gave its name to one of the Hundred courts, an ancient judicial system.

On past the sand and gravel pits where the Shropshire mammoth was discovered in 1986, towards Ryton, and not



visiting St. Edwards, Dorrington – for despite the pedestrian crossing over the A49, the road itself is very busy and two cyclists would not be welcome just where traffic can speed up along the straight towards Longnor. But there was a bonus, St. Thomas, Ryton, which I had not been aware of, before Longnor church, which was open like so many that day for reflection and remembrance.

Toby, who loves his cycling, persuaded me to tackle the Lawley route across country: Lodge Hill up to Hoar Edge, and on to Chatwall – bottom gear, maximum power stuff - and we only just made it! Then at last, freewheeling all the way, we reached St. James', Cardington – nearly home – where there had been a wedding earlier. Finally we gently cruised down Gilberries Lane and back home, this was now not the occa-

sion for Stoneacton Hill .....!

Very grateful thanks to all who sponsored me, and I am so glad we were able to do this once more.

Watch out for hedgehogs!

The hedgehog is one of our most endearing mammals. They can have as many as 5000 spines. A baby hedgehog is called a hoglet. Sadly they are steadily disappearing from the wild

They spend the day sleeping in hedgerows and under bushes and forage for food at night. They like to eat beetles, earwigs, caterpillars and worms. (YUK). From November to March they hibernate (sleep) in a nest of twigs, leaves and dried grasses and may do so in your garden. They are difficult to spot. They may be in your compost heap or log pile. Keep a careful watch.

You may like to make a picture like mine to remind you to look out for a possible hedgehog nest in your garden and not to disturb it. Every one is precious.

1.Go for a walk and collect some fallen leaves.

2. Copy my hedgehog shape onto stiff paper or card(eg. back of a ce-

real packet ) and cut it

3. Stick on your leaves and draw a face with a felt tip pen.

Put your hedgehog somewhere you can see him; the fridge door, perhaps.

#### **COVID** and Flu Vaccines

This year we will be providing Flu and COVID vaccines in large clinics based in William Brookes School. These vaccines will be delivered together as advised by the JCVI. For anyone wishing to have the vaccinations separately, this will be provided towards the end of the campaign in designated clinics. We will be using the Moderna Bivalent vaccine for all those aged 18 years or over, which has action against the Omicron COVID variant. The only exceptions will be those under 18 years of age who will require a Paediatric Dose of Pfizer, and those with true vaccine allergies, who will need referring to a designated clinic in Secondary Care. By the time of reading this some of you may have been contacted by us to book your vaccine, or even had them done. Our vaccine clinic timings are limited by the delivery dates of our vaccines which are beyond our control. We are however endeavouring to hold clinics as soon as possible after each delivery.

For any patients who are unable to leave their house we will be doing housebound vaccines, but we ask that anyone able to leave their home attends a clinic and we will facilitate vaccinations as needed. Our reception team will be contacting those patients who are known to be housebound, however if you are concerned we may not be aware of your circumstances please speak with our reception team. We are lucky to have a very community minded patient population, so if any of you aren't sure about a neighbour or friend, please ask them and help them out.

#### **Shingles and Pneumonia Vaccines**

Previously we have given these at the same time as Flu, however the Pneumonia and Shingles vaccines will now be given in dedicated clinics in the surgery which are being organised by our nursing team. If you are due one of these and not heard from us, then please contact the surgery and our reception team will be able to help.

#### Communications

We are aware that you are keen to know about these clinics and are going to do our upmost to communicate this across as many platforms as possible. This will include texting, Facebook, the practice website, the surgeries and local areas and shops. The best way to ensure you hear as soon as possible is to check we have the correct phone numbers and email for you. We will do our best to get information to you as soon as possible and as always appreciate your patience and understanding as we continue to develop our vaccination clinics during the Pandemic.
