### HALAM PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

29<sup>th</sup> June 2017 at 7.30 in Halam Village Hall

**Present:** S. Bust, G. Herbert, J. Simmons, S. Godfrey, C. Bevans; clerk P. Rickett.

Jill Sanderson from NDSC with Lisa Maine of Notts Community Housing: spoke re Affordable Housing, possible 6/7 houses to be built in Halam for residents who fit criteria - live/born/work/family connections. Halam PC survey in 2012 identified 3 people; In 2016 Edingley survey showed 3/4. Building 6/7 is more cost effective than just 3. The main problem is finding a site; land not normally considered for planning may be exempted; expected cost of site @ £8000. Halam PC/Housing Association would have control under a 106 Agreement re eligibility. Many questions were asked and answered. The Chairman asked those present if they felt another survey was needed. It was decided to circulate a copy of the survey for comments on the website: HalamVillage.org.uk & Facebook page Halam Village Community. The Chairman stated that no site has been identified. It was confirmed that no decision would be made without PC consent.

**Grant** The PC was informed that the grant has been awarded: £26,000. Mrs Godfrey was thanked for her work. A meeting will be held on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July at 6pm with a single item agenda to discuss this.

Roads and hedges: The verges have been cut; a pothole on Halam Hill has developed, Cllr. Laughton to check; request to be made to owners of hedge at bottom Halam Hill could cut back further to increase visibility when turning right into Radley Road.

<u>Defibrillator:</u> One is now in the phone box ready to use. The second site chosen is unsuitable due to box size and need for power; the clerk to approach the owners of Halam Salon on Radley Road, to see if one could be put there.

**Finance:** Cleaners £31; Grant 11%, third party donations £2795.00. Internal auditor Mrs Thompson is stepping down, clerk to arrange new internal auditor. End of year accounts ready for the auditor.

<u>Planning</u>: Installation of satellite dish on Manor House Radley Road – supported unanimously. <u>Planning Decision</u>: Land adjacent Cedar Lea – plans refused by NSDC.

<u>Date of next meetings:</u> Tuesday 4 July at 6pm – one item agenda Grant; Thursday 13 July at 7.30pm.

### Village Hall

The WREN grant for £26,000 has been approved and we would like to thank all those who kindly donated. (We had to raise 11% of the total amount if the cost of the work). We will be having new double glazed windows and a new, insulated roof, new gutters and reprinting the chimney. - Sarah Godfrey

### HALAM PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

Report from the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall on Thursday 13th July 2017 at 7.30pm

<u>Present:</u> Simon Bust, Andrew Paris, Chris Bevans, Sarah Godfrey, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds, Carolyn Todd.

Matters Arising: Andrew Paris asked about the village survey to assess the support for further investigation (questionnaire) for affordable homes in Halam. There is information regarding this on the village website - www.halamvillage.org.uk and on the Halam Village Facebook page. Printed information will also be circulated with Halam News. Please let the Parish Council have your feedback and comments

<u>Village Hall:</u> Yoga classes are now to be held one day a week rather than twice a week.

There has been some unauthorised parking at the hall occurring – the situation will be monitored.

<u>Village Hall Grant from WREN:</u> The Parish Council reviewed the work specifications put together by Andrew Paris & Sarah Godfrey. After a few amendments it was agreed to use these specs for the quote requests. The P.C. put together a list of potential contractors to do the required work on the hall; a request for quotes will be sent out by the Clerk. Quotes are required back by the next Parish Council meeting.

**Roads and Hedges:** The hedge at the bottom of Halam Hill still needs cutting back – Clerk will contact the householder.

County Cllr Bruce Laughton reported that further funds are being made available for road maintenance and Halam Hill is on the "Priority List".

<u>Defibrillator:</u> The second defibrillator is to be sited at Halam Salon; the Chairman and Clerk will assess the site and arrange mounting.

**Speedwatch:** Local police officer PCSO Crowhurst will be invited to a future meeting with a view to restarting the Community Speedwatch scheme, subject to effective police support.

<u>Litter:</u> The village seems to be suffering from a lot of litter currently; it would help if householders could at least keep their own frontages clear of litter.

<u>Dog Fouling:</u> Dog walkers are reminded that dog mess should be cleaned up on all public footpaths, not just hard pavements. There are still instances of bags of dog poo being left lying around and even being thrown onto private land. Please dispose of your dog mess bags responsibly. All dog owners are reminded that it is an offence not to clean up after their dog, and they can be fined up to £1,000.

<u>Internal Auditor</u>: Appointment of an internal auditor is in hand

### Open meeting:

- 1) <u>Fiskerton Tip:</u> County Cllr. Roger Jackson is trying to get this re-opened.
- 2) **Speedwatch:** members of the public expressed their support in getting this re-started and stated that volunteers would be available to run the scheme.

- 3) Affordable Housing: it was queried as to whether the land behind St Michael's close was under consideration for the scheme. The Clerk informed the meeting that he had been told by N&S District Council that this land is definitely NOT being considered: Cllr Laughton confirmed this
- 4) Open Space for Children: it was requested that this be put on the agenda for next month's meeting, particularly since the school field is out-of-bounds out of school hours. Chris Bevans will put a post on the village Facebook page to gauge support/interest for such an open space for village children to play on

<u>Correspondence:</u> Correspondence had been received raising the following issues:-

- 1) **Parking on Pavements** residents are reminded that it is an offence to obstruct the pavement. Space should be left for wheelchair or pushchair access. Please park with consideration for other road users and pavement users.
- 2) <u>Pigeons</u> the Parish Council has no powers to deal with such pest problems. It was suggested that the householder contact a professional pest control company if pigeons are a serious problem
- 3) Fly-tipping on Radley Road it was asked if a CCTV camera sign should be erected as a deterrent. This will be raised with Cllr Laughton at the next meeting. Fly-tipping can be reported to N & S District Council on Tel: 650 000 as they have a 'litter hitsquad' to deal with these issues. If you witness fly-tipping please try to note down vehicle description and registration number these should then be reported to the District Council too.

<u>Finance:</u> Unanimously agreed to pay for monthly cleaning.

<u>Date of next meeting:</u> Thursday 10th August 2017 at 8.00 pm (NB:- later start) in the village hall.

### **Garage Sale**

It is proposed to hold a garage sale in Halam with a small percentage of proceeds going towards the church roof fund, perhaps towards the end of September or beginning of October, to be held on a Saturday morning. This would take the form of a table to book in the village hall or in your own garage/drive. This would be an opportunity to sell on your unwanted items.

### HALAM PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

Parish Council Meeting held in Halam Village Hall on Thursday 10th August 2017 at 8.00 pm

<u>Present:</u> Simon Bust, Andrew Paris, Chris Bevans, Sarah Godfrey, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds, Carolyn Todd.

<u>Village Hall:</u> 1) Booking are quieter over the summer. The unauthorised parking at the hall is being monitored. 2) Village Hall WREN: Still awaiting some quotes back from builders & trades. An additional closed parish council meeting will be arranged once the quotes have all been received.

Roads and Hedges: The hedge at the bottom of Halam Hill has been back – Clerk will contact the householder to thank them for the work done so far, but ask if it can be cut back even further for road safety.

A cyclist has recently been injured coming off their bike due to the potholes on Halam Hill – this will be reported to Highways at the County Council, with a copy to County Cllr. Bruce Laughton, to emphasise the need for resurfacing work on the hill. These letters will also highlight problems with the flashing school sign lights (operating at the wrong times) and the non-functioning of the interactive speed sign.

<u>Defibrillator:</u> The second defibrillator is to be sited at the Halam Salon; on going checking and servicing of the devices is being looked into.

Speedwatch: The local police officer PCSO Crowhurst will be attending a future meeting (probably November when the meeting coincides with his shift pattern). In the meantime a meeting with volunteers and the police co-ordinator will be arranged to get this up and running again. Please contact Andrew Paris (815844) if you would like to find out more about volunteering on the village scheme.

<u>Open Space:</u> There has been a good response to the Facebook posting regarding this, indicating good support for the idea of an open area for village children to play. While there are obvious safety issues (and perhaps abuse issues!) to consider, it was agreed to investigate the idea of a village "playing field" further. NALC will be contacted to see what funding may be available, and a parishioner has volunteered to research grants etc. and report back to the parish council.

Affordable Housing: The response from the request for comments both on Facebook and in Halam News has, in the majority, been negative. After discussion, the Parish Council agreed (6 against: 1 in favour) not to proceed with any further survey by Newark & Sherwood District Council.

<u>Dog Bin:</u> The need for a second dog waste bin was discussed, and it was agreed to canvass the opinion of the village. The bin will cost £86 to buy, and then £96 every year for the District Council to empty. Do you think a second dog waste bin is needed? Can you suggest a suitable location? Please feed your views back to the Parish Council.

### Open meeting:

- 1) Potholes on Halam Hill comment was made by a member of the public that at least the poor surface of the road tends to slow motorists down, and improving the road surface could lead to vehicles going faster down the hill and into the village.
- 2) Railings alongside the Beck on the Turnpike these are in a poor state and need painting. This will be reported to County Council. Please note: all highways issues potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc. can be reported directly on Notts County Council website.

Alternatively you can telephone the council on **0300 500 80 80.** The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is to be resolved

- 3) Conservation Area for Halam it was asked if a conservation area for Halam would be a positive step. Andrew Paris will find out more from Newark & Sherwood DC.
- 4) Harvest Supper save the date! This will take place on Friday 22nd September.

### Planning:

- 1) Land at The Turnpike, Halam: outline planning permission for residential development of up to five dwellings after much discussion, taking into account the negative feedback from the village, it was unanimously agreed not to support the application, for these reasons:- development outside the built up part of the village; development on an open green space; setting a precedent, and especially the uncertainty of "outline" permission which could allow the applicant too many options.
- 2) Land adjacent the Old Vicarage, Halam Hill, Halam: outline planning permission for the erection of a new dwelling and access arrangements after discussion, it was agreed not to support the application as it was an 'outline' application giving no detail of the type of dwelling proposed. The Parish Council felt there were too many "unknowns".

Planning Decision: Kestrel Lodge, The Pumping Station, Radley Road: Householder Application for Removal of rear conservatory and Construction of extensions to sides, front and rear of the property and new roof tile covering – application approved by N&S District Council.

### **Manor Fields**

We understand that at the last meeting of the Parish Council it was suggested that a dog bin be placed at the centre area of Manor Field's drive (the small grassed area with trees). ### Report from the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> August 2017 at 7.30 pm

### **Matters Arising**

Noise disturbance is still being experienced from revving motorbikes in the village. Persistent noise can be reported to Environmental Health at the District Council - 01636 650000

### Village Hall

The idea of sound baffles to improve the hall acoustics was discussed; this could possibly be part of a second phase of improvements following the completion of the planned structural works. Sarah Godfrey will contact an acoustics specialist to find out more.

Heater repairs are in hand.

Unauthorised parking is becoming an issue again – the Clerk will write again to the household involved.

### **Village Hall Grant from WREN**

The details of the preferred builder have been sent to WREN. It was agreed that Sarah Godfrey and Andrew Paris would be the authorised signatory on official documentation to do with the works.

### **Roads and Hedges**

Halam Hill will be closed for patching work from 8 a.m. on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> October until 3.30 p.m. Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October.

The Clerk has met with the County Council footpaths officer to review the state of the paths in Halam.

A fence is broken behind Manor Fields on the foot path up to Machins Farm.

It is proposed to introduce a 50mph speed limit on the Southwell to Lowdham road.

The Clerk was asked to contact District Cllr Penny Rainbow who is chair of the Safer Neighbourhood Group to request that the mobile speed van comes to Halam.

Following objections by the parish council, the proposed illuminated crossroads sign is to be relocated to the grass verge by the Waggon car park. The pavement at the original site was too narrow for the installation of the new sign.

### **Harvest Supper**

The event raised £318 – many thanks to all involved to make this such and enjoyable and successful evening.

### **Conservation Area**

Andrew Paris has made initial contact with the conservation officer at District Council; it was agreed to invite the officer to address the parish council at the December meeting.

### **Speed Watch**

Andrew Paris has spoken to local police officer, PCSO Crowhurst, and it is planned that the officer will tell the parish council how the current scheme operates and

what support is available from the police, including official speed monitoring.

### Open Space

The pub has said that the field behind the overflow car park can be made available for village events. The landlord will be approached to see if more casual use by youngsters can be arranged. The insurance and safety aspects of this will require further research.

### Dog Bin/Litter Bin

The District Council have said that a bin will be reinstated at the bus shelter.

There was little feedback relating to the need and positioning of a second dog bin. County Cllr Bruce Laughton said that he could make some money available for its purchase. It is now proposed to mount the new bin on the wooden "footpath" post at the entrance to Manor Fields.

### **Open meeting**

- 1) It was asked in a 50mph speed limit could be applied to the road from Southwell to Halam. County Cllr Bruce Laughton said that he would ask the highways department to investigate this and report back.
- 2) New LED street lamps correspondence was received questioning the need for such tall, bright lights. Cllr Laughton stated that these LED lights will more than half the cost of street lights for the County Council. He told the meeting that the County Council will install light baffles on any street lamps that cause issues by shining into residents' homes. Cllr Laughton will investigate the issues of height and brightness.
- 3) Railings alongside the Beck on the Turnpike these are still in a poor state and need painting. A parishioner has reported this to County Council Highways. The parish council will raise this with Cllr Laughton at the next meeting.

Please note: - all highways issues – potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc. – can be reported directly on the County Council website - www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk – or by calling the council on 0300 500 80 80. The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is likely to get resolved

4) State of the hedges along School Lane – the hedges are too wide, and so tall that they are in danger of damaging the telephone wires. The Clerk will write to Norwood Golf Course about the height of their hedges.

Unanimously agreed to pay for monthly cleaning of the village hall, and auditor for council accounts. The need for more salt for the village grit bins will be checked.

### **Speed watch**

Unfortunately, PCSO Keith Crowhurst was not available to attend the meeting due to a major incident in Southwell.

A meeting with PCSO Crowhurst and volunteers from the village will be arranged as soon as possible.

District Cllr Penny Rainbow will contact Highways to see if a police speed van can visit Halam.

### **Matters Arising**

Conservation Area – Andrew Paris has contacted Oliver Scott, Senior Conservation Officer at N&S DC who is scheduled to attend the January parish council meeting. Defibrillator – signage for the defibrillator in the phone box

has been ordered. The second defibrillator is to be mounted on the street lamp post at the junction of Gray Lane and Radley Road.

### Village Hall

All but one of the heaters have now been repaired – an element is being sourced for the remaining broken heater. The new insulated roof should help greatly with the warmth

Sarah Godfrey will report back on the possibility of sound baffling at the next meeting.

The usual Christmas tree will be organised.

### Village Hall Grant from WREN

The builder's quotation has been accepted and all signed paperwork has been sent to WREN. The appointed Paul Garratt Builders Ltd will now be contacted to start work as soon as possible. It will not be possible to let the hall during renovation works so a start date and timescale is needed so that current bookings can be cancelled/re-arranged as necessary.

Sarah Godfrey and Mandy Rickett are to check whether any pledged donations are still outstanding.

### Roads and Hedges

Repair work has now been completed to Halam Hill.

The hedge at the bottom of Halam Hill has been cut back, but still needs further reduction - Clerk to speak to the householder.

The orange, flashing school lights are still operating at unnecessary times.

The railings alongside the Beck are definitely the responsibility of the County Council, but there is no funding to re-paint them.

Please note: - all highways issues – potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc. - can be reported the County Council website on www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk - or by calling the council on 0300 500 80 80. The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is likely to get resolved.

Glenys Herbert reported that some footpaths have been restricted by electric fences – this should be temporary and the issue(s) should be resolved very shortly. Some other footpath maintenance is underway e.g. bridge railings being replaced.

A parishioner has spoken to Highways regarding physical speed reduction through the village and maybe even a crossing at the school. Mike Keeling from County Council is to investigate.

A petition signed by 132 parishioners has been sent to County Cllr Bruce Laughton in support of reducing the speed limit along the road from Southwell to Halam to 50 mph.

### Dog Bin & Litter Bin

The new litter bin has now been mounted on the bus shelter. The new dog bin is to be sited at the entrance to Manor Fields on the footpath post on the verge on Radley Road. The County Council footpath officer will arrange for a new mounting post if the footpath sign post is not sufficient.

### **Data Protection**

Any correspondence from parishioners read out at meetings are to remain anonymous in future, unless the writer instructs otherwise.

The parish council does not hold any personal details on a data base or other record.

#### **Speed watch**

Andrew Paris has spoken to local police officer, PCSO Crowhurst, and it is planned that the officer will tell the parish council how the current scheme operates and what support is available from the police, including official speed monitoring.
