Minutes of the Meeting of Belsay Parish Council held on **Wednesday, 28 January 2026** Sir Stephen Middleton Memorial Hall, Belsay First School

40. Apologies for Absence

Apologies for absence received from Cllrs Common, Mole and Storey.

41. Declarations of Interest

None Received

42. Public Questions (Maximum 5 minutes per person)

a) Grade II Listed Pant (Belsay village)

Mrs Clegg reported that Belsay Estates considered the addition of a trough to be an excellent idea and were happy to support the funding. Cowells Garden Centre had quoted £229.49 for an Errington Reay trough (supply, delivery, plants). Alternatively, a stone trough could be sourced through Belsay Estates or via salvage. Maintenance of the proposal would need further investigation and agreement.

It was **AGREED:**

- The Parish Council support up to 50% of the funding of an appropriate trough.
- Mrs Clegg assisted with sourcing.

43. Minutes of the Previous Meeting of Belsay Council held on 26 November 2025

Confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

44. Matters Arising from the Previous Meeting

a) Emergency Resilience Base and Generator

Cllr Straughan reported that she had contacted Jake Delacey, Community Buildings Energy Advisor at Community Action Northumberland, with a view to organising a visit to the school hall to discuss requirements and offer advice.

It was noted that Northern Power Grid Foundation have moved to an assessment window for energy resilience grants. Completion of an eligibility quiz can be taken at any time.

It was **AGREED**:

- Cllr Straughan contacts Jake at CAN to seek availability in February with a view to holding an Extraordinary Parish Meeting.
- Cllr Straughan to complete the Northern Power eligibility quiz to obtain an instant eligibility result and report back.
- Cllr Straughan to approach Ray Wind Farm Fund for grant eligibility.

45. Highways Matters

a) Gateways

County Cllr Dodd reported that he had still not received a response from Neil Snowdon at NCC regarding the gateway specifications. The costs are estimated at £3,000 per gate. It was suggested that, as an alternative, rumble strips could be used. Cllr Dodd agreed to look into the requirements.

b) Overhanging Branches and Hedges

County Cllr Dodd reported that some cutting back had been carried out at Wallridge; however, this had not resolved the issue, and there remained significant overhanging vegetation within the parish. This needs to be addressed through Kris Westerby, Head of Highways at NCC.

It was **AGREED**:

- Cllr Straughan identifies the problem areas on a map and passes this to County Cllr Dodd to present to Kris Westerby.

County Cllr Dodd left the meeting at this point.

46. Planning Matters

a) Previous applications detailed on the agenda had been circulated to members with nothing to report.

b) Application 22/01909/CCMEIA

The Chair reported that she had lodged a representation on behalf of Belsay Parish Council and would speak on behalf of the Parish at the planning committee meeting on 3 February 2026.
