

#### 59 Bus Route

The last meeting of the East of Maidstone Rural Transport Group was held on 16<sup>th</sup> July.

Following the changes to the service in April (Grafty Green not really affected) and KCC picking up the funding for the 0721 to Maidstone on Monday to Friday non-schooldays and the 17.25 from Maidstone on Mondays to Fridays, the 59 service is now said by the Arriva representative to be performing financially very well and no further changes are seen to be needed.

I asked that the 12.20 from Maidstone on Mondays to Fridays should now return in service to Maidstone, as it always used to, instead of returning 'not in service', as the reason for it having to get back to Maidstone quickly no longer existed after the service changes in April. The Arriva rep agreed to consider this suggestion which had the support of the other parishes present.

The KCC rep advised that there were no current plans for subsidy withdrawals for financial year 2012 –13 but stressed that pressures on the budget during this time (resulting from commercial service withdrawals e.t.c) could change this situation. Awareness therefore needs to be given to the fact that the joint 13,59,28,29 Saturday contract could be under threat if such pressures were forthcoming. He agreed to advise the group as soon as possible if such a scenario was likely.

The Saturday contract is due for renewal from April 2014 and the KCC rep confirmed that any decision on a reworked contract would take place in the summer of 2013 ready for the new contract start date of April 2014 and that the group could be involved in any such discussions.

New buses are due in Maidstone in the next few months which should enable all buses on the 59 to worked by low floor (easy access) vehicles from Feb next year.

The next meeting of the group is scheduled for 14th January 2013.

## **Grafty Gourmet**

Having been to only 3 BBQ's this summer, we are promised an Indian Summer (apparently). So dust the cobwebs from the BBQ and try this very easy yet tasty recipe. The chicken served with fresh pineapple and bacon salsa is refreshing with a hint of smokiness from the bacon.

## **BBQ Chicken with Pineapple & Bacon Salsa - Serves 4**

4 skinless chicken breasts
Salt and pepper, to taste
2 cups of your favourite barbecue sauce
Olive oil, for brushing the BBQ grill

For the Pineapple Bacon Salsa:

2 cups diced fresh pineapple 4 strips cooked bacon, chopped 1/2 cup chopped Coriander 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion 3 tablespoons finely chopped Jalapeno pepper 1 clove garlic, minced Juice of 1 large lime Salt and pepper, to taste

- 1. Season the chicken breasts with salt and pepper. Place the chicken breasts in a large freezer bag. Add the barbecue sauce and mix until breasts are covered. Let the chicken marinate in the refrigerator for 1 hour.
- 2. Make the Pineapple Bacon Salsa in a medium sized bowl. Combine pineapple, bacon, coriander, red onion, jalapeno, garlic, and lime juice. Stir until well combined. Season with salt and pepper, to taste.
- 3. When the chicken has marinated, brush the grill on the BBQ at medium-high heat with olive oil. Remove the chicken breasts from the bag and place on the grill. Discard the leftover barbecue sauce and the bag.
- 4. BBQ chicken until cooked through, about 5 minutes per side. Remove from grill and serve warm with the Pineapple Bacon Salsa

## **Parish Council Funding**

You may have seen in the media that there are changes afoot regarding Parish Council Funding. Indeed, changes have already been imposed which have resulted in the amount BMPC (and other parish councils) receive from Maidstone Borough Council, being reduced. And it could be about to get much worse.

Up until two years ago, Parishes, on average, obtained about one-third of their funding via a grant from Maidstone Borough Council – the Concurrent Functions Grant. The remainder came from Precept, a "local tax" added to Council Tax bills, collected by MBC and then passed to the relevant Parish Council.

The Concurrent Functions Grant scheme was established in the early 1970's and updated some 25 years ago, its aim was to recognise that Parishes directly provide certain services that the Borough provides in non-parished (generally urban) areas and therefore parishes should be recompensed so that they do not pay twice for the same service – that is, "double-taxation" through Council Tax and, separately, through local Precept for the same service.

However, the Concurrent Functions Grant is now under threat and the scheme may be abolished and replaced with a "Parish Services Scheme". Under that proposed scheme it would appear that each parish council would get a much reduced amount. What that means for us in Boughton Malherbe is that where as now, the Precept we pay in our Council Tax is in the region of £9 per year (varying dependant on property band) an early estimate suggests that this could increase up to three-fold.

Rest assured that your Parish Council is not taking this lightly and has joined forces with other Parish Councils to work towards a fairer way forward. I write to explain the background to what is going on and will keep you fully informed.

## More on SKYPE? (This is the last one on Skype) Group Calling



You can speak to more than one person at a time, which can be good for meetings or just having group conversations with friends or family who are not in the same place.

Select the people you want to talk to from the Contacts List by holding down the "Ctrl" key (bottom left-hand side of the keyboard) which will allow you to select more than one person.

Once you have them in a group you will notice that the Call button changes to a Group Call, so

you can now select that and it will call everyone at the same time.



You will see the people you have selected in the display at the top right of the Skype screen. If the person hasn't got a picture they will appear as a ? When they talk their picture will flash.

You can also drag the people you want to make a group call with into the display box at the top of the call page, then make a call.

If you are talking to someone already and then decide to add someone, you can just select them and add them to the call.

You **will not** be able to do Video calls with groups unless you pay a subscription to Skype.

## **Instant Messages**

You can send instant messages to people using in Skype.

Select the person you wish to send a message to in the Contacts List, then in the bottom of the right-hand screen, type your message, then click on the Blue Speech Balloon, or just press Enter on the keyboard to send the message.



If they are not available they will see the message when they next open Skype. You can also add an Emotion to your message

This is very useful if you want to check that someone is available for a Skype call. It is also good when you want to make a comment to one of the people in a Group Call. Remember to make sure you select the person you want the message to go to, otherwise you may send something inappropriate to the group that was only meant for one person.



## The September Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Leo at the start of September, and moves into Virgo later in the month.

**New Moon** occurs on Sunday  $16^{th}$  September, and **Full Moon** is on Sunday  $30^{th}$  September.

**Mercury** is in superior conjunction (almost directly behind the Sun) on 10<sup>th</sup> September, so we will not be able to see this elusive little planet this month.

**Venus** is rising in the north-east in the early hours, and by dawn the brilliant "Morning Star" will be well up in the eastern sky. Relative to the stars, it is moving rapidly eastwards out of Gemini and into the constellation of Leo. Very little detail can be seen through a telescope apart from a rather featureless white disc.

**Mars** is very low in the western sky at dusk, and throughout September sets only a couple of hours after sunset. Again it will be difficult to see in the twilight.

**Jupiter** rises in the northeast in the late evening, and is high in the eastern sky at dawn. Relative to the stars it is moving very slowly eastward in the constellation of Taurus. Through a telescope you may be able to see the dark and light bands, and some of Jupiter's four major moons.

**Saturn** is low in the western sky at sunset and sets only an hour after the Sun, It will, therefore, not be easy to view in the bright twilight sky. The planet will disappear behind the Sun next month.

I know that most of you would have read about NASA's Curiosity Rover, which successfully landed on Mars on  $6^{th}$  August. The curiosity Rover, which was launched from Earth on  $26^{th}$  November last year, travelled 352 million miles in  $8\frac{1}{2}$  months, and landed on the surface of Mars after a carefully executed entry at 13,200mph.

The Rover, which is virtually a mobile laboratory, is 10ft x 9ft x 7ft high, and weighs 2000lbs. With its six large wheels it will be able to move across the surface of the 'Red Planet'. The Curiosity's goal is to scour for basic ingredients essential for life, including carbon, nitrogen, phosphorous, sulphur and oxygen. The main aim for future missions is to bring back to Earth samples of rock and soil for detailed analysis in order to determine whether Mars may have supported life.

## **Christian Message September 2012**

#### **Maidstone Street Pastors**

"So what's a Street Pastor then" this is probably the most asked question that we get on a Saturday night. The answer is simple "We are a group of Christians from Churches in & around the Maidstone area and we come out on a Saturday night between 10pm and 4am, to look after the vulnerable, engage with people and generally try to make sure people are safe" The response is usually pretty much the same & never fails to surprise me......firstly, people can't believe that we don't get paid & secondly, they don't understand why we would even want to do it!!! Well let me tell you after being part of the team for 3 years now it certainly is one of the most amazing ministries I have ever been fortunate enough to be involved with.

It has been fantastic to witness the change in people's attitude towards the Church & us in general. When I first stated going out in 2009, some were still a little suspicious of our motives and saw us as the local do-gooders. It would have been easy in those first few months to admit defeat & give up, but we carried on regardless, knowing that God had called each & every one of us to this Ministry. Now some 4 years after Maidstone Street Pastors was launched I feel we are a more understood & respected part of the night-time economy. We have even been asked by the police to pray for certain areas of the town that have been particular hotspots for trouble!! Many of the door staff will talk to us about problems in their personal lives & ask us to pray for them, the homeless know that they can count on us for the odd hot drink or sandwich, but more importantly we will listen to them & care for them. It is not unusual now to hear the youngsters say "that's the Church people, they're the ones you can trust, they're the ones that will look after us later" they will high five you as they walk past or they will run up & give you a hug & thank you for taking care of them sometime before. So you see seeds are being planted, no matter how small & who knows where a small act of kindness & love will lead. How great it is to see God's Spirit at work on our streets & how amazing it is to see prayers being answered (sometimes instantaneously) week after week.

I would like to leave you with this thought; Street Pastors don't go out to preach, it is not our place to condemn or judge we simply take God's love out on our streets. In 1 John 4 v 7 it says "**Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God."** As Christians, I believe it really should be that simple.

There are now 2 Street Pastors & 5 Prayer Pastors in the Len Valley Benefice, but more are always welcome. If you are interested please do not hesitate to call me or look at the Maidstone street pastors website for more info.
