



### Compassionate Cafe

The Kingsbridge Compassionate Cafe for bereavement support is run by volunteers under the auspices of St Lukes Hospice. They are not counsellors but are good listeners – compassionate friends.

We know that coming along to something new – especially something like a Compassionate Cafe – might feel a bit daunting. If you're grieving, caring for someone, living with loss, or simply feeling isolated, walking into a room of people you don't know can feel like a big step. It is a confidential group & we thank you for not sharing the thoughts & comments made by others. So here's what actually happens...

When you arrive, a volunteer will welcome you with a cuppa and a gentle chat – nothing formal, just a check-in to help you feel at ease. You can stay one-to-one if you prefer, or join the table where a small group gathers. Sometimes the conversation is light hearted, about the weather, local news, or day-to-day things.

Someone might mention a loved one they've lost or share a memory. Tears might be shed and that's OK. Those moments are important and can be shared without judgement. There's no expectation to talk about anything personal. Some people just sit quietly in a space where they feel understood. Others come because it's the only time that week they'll be around people who truly "get it."

There's usually three or more of the volunteers, and a mixed group of visitors ranging from three or four to as many as ten. Tea, coffee & biscuits are readily available. Conversations shift and settle naturally & the room adapts to what is needed.

No need to book, just come as you are. However if you would like someone to meet you outside so you don't have to walk in alone, or have any questions, please contact us on [compassionatecafekingsbridge@gmail.com](mailto:compassionatecafekingsbridge@gmail.com) and someone will get back to you. We meet on the second and fourth Saturday of every month from 10:30 until 12:00 at the Methodist Church at the top of Fore Street in Kingsbridge. You're not alone & you're always welcome!

## Scam Alert: Fake Parking Fine Messages

During recent cybercrime awareness public engagement events across Devon and Cornwall, several attendees have reported receiving fraudulent parking fine notifications sent via text message and email.

### How to Spot the Scam

As a general rule, real parking fines (Penalty Charge Notices) are never issued via a text or email message.

If you receive this sort of message, please look for these red flags:

- Missing details: The message may not include your vehicle registration number, the specific car park/location, or the exact date/time of the incident.
- False urgency: They use "scare tactics," threatening that the fine will double or triple if you don't pay quickly.
- Suspicious links: They will urge you to click a link to "pay now." These links lead to fake websites designed to steal your bank details.

### What You Should Do

- Do not click: never click links in unexpected texts or emails.
- Verify: if you are worried, check with your local council or the private parking firm directly using a trusted website or an independently verified phone number. NEVER call any phone numbers included in the original message.
- Report it:
- Texts: forward the message to 7726 (it's free and alerts mobile providers.)
- Emails: forward to [report@phishing.gov.uk](mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk).
- Fraud: report to [reportfraud.police.uk](http://reportfraud.police.uk) or call 0300 123 2040.

If you think you have lost money or given out sensitive financial information to scammers, immediately alert your bank/financial institution. Call them right away to inform them of the suspicious incident. You can quickly reach many UK banks' fraud departments by calling 159.

## The National Trust

Despite a lovely settled dry cold spell over Christmas, the wet and wind has returned making our work challenging! With storms moving through on a regular basis, the rangers and volunteers have been busy tidying up fallen trees and branches. Please get in touch if you notice anything that needs clearing.

We have been continuing the hedgerow planting in the fields behind Bolberry; at least the wet ground will be good for the plants rather than frozen fields. Our volunteer groups and the local Force for Nature group have been doing a fantastic job planting thousands of small trees including blackthorn, hawthorn, wild privet, honeysuckle and gelder rose. As well as being hardy, these provide great sources of nectar and berries for the wildlife once they mature.

The teams have also been out clearing old fencelines of vegetation so they can be replaced before the bird nesting season. We have also had some volunteers out through the Life on the Edge project clearing gorse off Bolt Head to help stop this spreading over the wildflower-rich grassland areas. If you are interested in finding out more about this fantastic project to improve habitat for invertebrates across the south Devon coastline please search for Life on the Edge – South Devon National Landscape.

The work continues on the new permissive bridleway and footpath through the back of the Bolberry Down area. As mentioned before we look forward to sharing more detail about the route soon and enjoying a launch event once it is in place in late spring. This will provide an extensive new circular link with the coast path for walkers, and some new access for riders and cyclists. It also opens up some fantastic new views of the landscape.


## Parish Council Notes

Our January meeting had a busy agenda as we do not meet in December. Our County Councillor Louise Wainwright brought us up-to-date on council matters and was questioned by several present about the ongoing pothole and road maintenance programme. Please remember to report potholes as they do get filled, though this does seem to takes weeks sometimes.

We were sad to receive the resignation of Sarah Prowse, who has been a valuable Parish Councillor, so we will be advertising to co-opt someone to fill her position. Do contact our Clerk or any Councillor for more information if you think you could join us.

We also had a visit from two members of the local South Hams Ramblers who meet in our area every month or so and have recently set up the South Hams Way – a circular walk round the South Hams linking up the South West Coast Path with inland paths. 
