#### When can I .....?

On the assumption that the Government confirms that we can all move to Step 2 of the Roadmap these are some of the things that will change in the village from April 12th:-

#### Now:

- All outdoor children's activities allowed.
- Organised outdoor sport allowed (i.e. football on the Rec)
- Play areas at Stonehill, Memorial Hall and the Recreation Ground open
- Parents and children (up to 15 people) can meet outdoors.
- Minimal travel now allowed
- No holidays allowed, domestic or international.

#### 12 April (at the earliest):

- All non-essential retail now opens in village incl. hairdressers and personal care salons.
- Outdoors Up to 6 people can meet outdoors (or two households) in our gardens and on the Recreation or Memorial Hall Grounds
- Outdoors Fleur de Lys and Prince of Wales can offer drinks outside (only). No indoor drinking. Takeaways continue at pubs.
- Indoors Parents and children (up to 15 people) can meet (i.e. at the Memorial Hall Stoke Baby & Toddler Group and Music Bugs, and at the Hamdon Youth Centre Brownies, Youth Group and Blackrock Irish Dancers
- Indoors No other community activities allowed yet (planned for May)
- We can stay away overnight (your own household only, not mixed with others)
- No international holidays allowed yet.

An update to this will be set out in the May newsletter on what the Step 3 changes will be.

## CHAIR'S UPDATE

We were very pleased to co-opt a new parish councillor, Paul Jeffery, at our March meeting. Paul was born in the village and has lived here all his life apart from a brief spell in Yeovil and Ilchester. He has now come back to the village and lives at the top of the High Street with his wife and young family. Paul is able to bring both business and practical skills to the team, and like other councillors is already involved in many other village activities and organisations. We welcome him warmly as part of our team.

#### Vandalism

It's very sad to see that there has been quite a lot of anti-social behaviour over the past month by persons unknown. There was a spate of car damage in West Street one Saturday afternoon involving damage to and theft of car mirrors. Graffiti has also been plastered over the BT broadband cabinet near Windsor Lane, the one at the bottom of North Street, and also on the one by Stanchester playing fields.

On Monday 8 March between around 17.30 and 17.40 three male youths were captured on CCTV throwing around used dog-mess

bags in the children's adventure play area at the Recreation Ground in Stoke sub Hamdon. They proceeded to slap the bags on the slide and the roundabout, spreading the mess. The incident, along with relevant details, has been reported to the police. Thanks go to those who reported this and those who took it upon themselves to clear up the mess. Incidents of anti-social behaviour are taken very seriously. They will not be tolerated, and CCTV footage will be used to take action. Dog fouling can be reported to SSDC via their web site.

People are strongly encouraged to immediately report ANY incidents of anti-social behaviour they see directly for themselves. The Recreation Ground, the Memorial Hall and the Stoke Working Men's Club all have CCTV cameras that can record to provide evidence for the police. Incidents should be reported to the police by calling the non-emergency number 101. The process is simple and straightforward, and those who take these calls are extremely helpful. The more incidents that are reported a bigger picture emerges that will enable the authorities to divert resources to any particular problem.

## YOUTH CENTRE TO RE-OPEN

The Hamdon Youth & Family Centre is due to re-open from April 12th (depending on the Government confirmation that the country moves to Step 2 of the Roadmap date). The Youth Group, Brownies and Blackrock Irish Dancers are all really looking forward to being able to meet up again! It's been a long year.

During the time, the Centre has been closed Phase 1 of the planned refurbishment work on the building has been carried out. New energy efficient lighting and heating has been installed in both halls and the old night storage heater sockets converted to power points. The redundant pews have been recycled within the village. The main church hall floor which was laid directly on the earth has been dug out and replaced with a new concrete floor, damp proof membrane and insulation. Good quality wood flooring was laid at the end of March and the Centre now has two usable halls available for children's activities. Phase 2 of the works to create a kitchen, office and new toilets including disabled facilities etc is planned to start in the Summer. The Centre was purchased by the parish council on behalf of the village at the end of 2018 through the Community Right to Bid legislation. The Council are funding the refurbishment; day to day management of the Centre is carried out by a charitable trust made up of the service users themselves.

## VILLAGE LITTER PICK

Thank you so much to the volunteers for the litter pick. There were 19 altogether which was absolutely fantastic; the weather stayed fine, and we collected 25 bags of rubbish, all the way from Holy Tree to the Co-Op and from the top of Ham Hill to the A303 bridge and beyond.
