


Celebration of Life for Max Hilleard

Litter Picking

Hayford Homes has provided the village with £200 worth of litter picking equipment. This was gratefully received by Steve Tuck and the litter pickers.

OCC latest plans to address Congestion

Oxfordshire County Council and Oxford City Council have announced plans to tackle congestion on all major routes into Oxford and improve public transport connections into and across some parts of the city. The two councils specify that they want to make real improvement to journey times for commuters and quality of life for residents, including improved air quality, by reducing the number of cars travelling into and around the city. The key points of the Connecting Oxford proposal are:

- Restricting car traffic by introducing additional 'bus gates'
- New high frequency fast bus routes connecting neighbouring towns and the Park & Rides to Oxford's eastern arc
- · · New and improved cycle and walking routes
- A charge for workplace parking provided by larger employers which would help fund the proposed transport improvements. Discounts for the new bus services would be available for staff of employers paying the workplace parking levy

There appears to be no suggestion of reinstating bus services to isolated villages within this proposal. There is more information on the Connecting Oxford proposals are available at www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/connectingoxford along with a short survey on the proposals. The deadline for submissions is 20th October 2019.

Be prepared for winter weather

Are you prepared for severe weather conditions?. Make sure you are ready for any snow, blizzards, fog, ice, frost, freezing, rain or hail. They can all cause disruptions to our daily lives. Although we cannot change the weather, we can be prepared for winter related emergencies inside the home or while you are out and about. Oxford County Council has a number of useful document on their web site

This is also a good time for the Parish Council to ask for volunteers who would be willing to spread salt on high risk areas around the village. You don't have to be very strong to undertake this task. The aim is to have sufficient volunteers so that each one only need to look after a small area. From Oxfordshire to the Orne: Normandy 75th Anniversary exhibition comes to the Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum

Collections Day will encourage members of the public to bring objects to the museum and tell their stories of Oxfordshire from the Second World War to the 1970's. Any objects donated or loaned on the day will be used to form our Second World War and Reminiscence displays.

The Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum is open from Tuesday-Friday 10am-5pm, Saturday 11am-5pm and Sunday 2pm-5pm. The county's only military history museum is located in the grounds of the Oxfordshire Museum, Park Street, Woodstock.
