MINUTES of the COUNCIL MEETING

Held on Monday 7th February 2011 at 7pm in the Welstead Room, Compton Village Hall.

2259 **Apologies for absence** had been received from District Councillor B Alexander

2260 Any declarations of personal or prejudicial interest by members or the Clerk

2262 To approve the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 10 January 2011

2263 Matters arising from the minutes of the Council Meeting on 10 January 2011

2246 The Clerk said that our contractor had confirmed that his charge for cutting the grass around the Scout Hut would be the same as last year.

2264 Clerk's report

The Clerk went through his report, which is at Attachment 1.

- 1. Floodlights: The Chairman said that he had authorised the contractors to take down all 3 of the remaining floodlight columns in the car park on health and safety grounds. Two of the 4 were currently being replaced, although they were not working yet because of water damage in the football pavilion. He asked the Clerk to put the replacement of the other 2 floodlights as an item on the next Council meeting agenda.
- 2. Dog waste bin: The Clerk was asked to arrange for the new bin in Wilson Close to be relocated by West Berkshire Council to the position originally requested
- 9. Compilations Adverts: The Clerk said it was taking him considerable time to ascertain the details of some of the advertisers and prepare and send out 72 individual invoices for 2010. KS suggested that it would be better if advertisers paid in advance; the Clerk was asked, with the help of the Compilations Editor, to prepare a proposal for the next meeting.

2266 To consider how best to ensure the continuance of service provision at the Downlands Day Care Centre after it closes in September

Following discussion and comments / questions from members of the public, DA proposed that a meeting be convened of interested parties in the near future. This was seconded by BE and was carried. DA proposed Wednesday 16 February at 7pm and asked the Clerk to confirm the availability of the Welstead Room and then send out a calling notice. A list of interested parties was drawn up and it was agreed that DA and MP would attend the initial meeting on behalf of the Parish Council.

2267 To receive an update on the redevelopment of Fairfield

The Clerk had been advised that the Planning Application had been temporarily withdrawn to enable a tree report and ecological evaluation (mainly for the presence of bats) to be carried out.

2268 To consider the current churchyard situation and respond to a request from the Parochial Church Council

The Clerk had prepared a 1-page procedural summary on extending burial grounds which had highlighted the need to avoid an area with potential flooding problems or a high water table. He had contacted the Clerks of 2 neighbouring Parish Councils and had also had a meeting with the local Team Rector. He was now awaiting a reply from the owner of nearby land to whom he had written.

To approve expenditure of up to £100 to purchase felt for the roof of an allotment shed from which asbestos has recently been removed

Proposed by DA, seconded by KS and carried.

2270 To receive feedback from the meeting on 27 January to discuss the future of the IAH site and consider and agree actions

BE gave a brief report on the conduct and outcomes of the meeting which was followed by a discussion. AS then proposed that a sub-committee be set up to open discussions with Powis-Hughes on how best the Parish Council can support BBSRC in its withdrawal from the village. The proposal was seconded by KS and was carried. It was agreed that AS, KS, MB and LM should serve on the sub-committee.

2271 To receive an update on the project to erect a possible footway from Lowbury Gardens along the south side of the High Street to the village shop

The Clerk was now in possession of the information concerning which properties were owned by A2Dominion Homes. He would now write to all owners of the affected properties asking for their views of the proposed project.

2272 To receive an update on the application for Village Green status for the green area in Gordon Crescent and decide whether or not to formulate a proposal to BBSRC to transfer the green space in Gordon Crescent to Parish Council ownership

It was agreed that consideration of this application would not be progressed until the above sub-committee (minute 2270) had completed their deliberations.

2273 To discuss whether to support the Village Hall management committee proposal to site a clothes recycling bin at the village hall

AS was concerned about who would monitor the site to ensure clothes were not strewn around especially when the bin became full. PS understood that the situation would be monitored regularly and the charity would be contacted and requested to empty the bin when it was getting full. DA proposed that the Parish Council support the bin. This was seconded by BE and the Clerk was asked to contact the Village Hall management committee.
