COUNCIL NEWS

The Council welcomed Amanda Jobling, the new Parish Council Clerk, to her first Council meeting last month and the transition between her taking over the post from Brendan Gibbs has gone extremely smoothly. Amanda has started to review some of the Council's procedures to see if improvements and efficiencies can be made.

Reassuring news for Hamble and Hound is that the High Court has refused a Judicial Review of the Secretary of State's decision to refuse Hallam Land Management's application for a development next to Hamble Station. The judge also awarded costs to the authorities for preparing for this Judicial Review.

Provisional plans for a Dementia Care Home at Mursell Way, adjacent to the Blackthorn Health Centre, have been presented to the Parish Council by a Director of the company making the proposal. The company said it only built for charities and not for profits organisations and had held consultations with people in the local area, including the Health Centre. It anticipated putting in a formal planning application within the next month. The main consideration is its location within the local gap.

Another representation to the Council has been made by Richard Beach from the Beach Hut Cafe on the Foreshore. The cafe wish to apply for a 'table licence' so that customers can have an alcoholic drink with their meal. The terms of the cafe's lease prohibits the selling of alcohol and it approached the Council to see if it was amenable to varying the lease. The cafe would not remain open beyond 8pm as it did not wish to impinge on other businesses in the village.

Unfortunately Hamble is still suffering, similar to other communities, from fly tipping that costs the public authorities a substantial amount to remove. A large quantity of tyres were dumped and a car was burnt out on Westfield Common. As will be seen elsewhere in the magazine, BP have had to temporarily close the car park adjacent to the Copse, that it allows the public to use, due to similar incidents.



The new storage building to centralise the Council groundstaff's equipment is under construction at the College Playing Fields and hopefully when you read this it will be completed. After this the equipment stored in the end of life storage units around the Council's estate will be moved to this new facility and the old units removed. Again unfortunately, some vandals damaged the surface of the concrete base before it set.

Many of Hamble older residents have been involved and benefited from ESPOPH (Eastleigh Southern Parishes Older People's Forum) over the last 20 years. Last November it held its final meeting, but before this organisation ceased its activities it produced its seventh report entitled 'Alarming Conclusions - Older people and emergencies'.

The Parish Council has set up a Christmas lighting and decoration group to review current arrangements and to seek to make improvements. The group will be starting shortly as decisions such as applying for consents have to be done early and it will be co-opting interested parishioners to contribute their ideas. Other groups and organisations maybe approached to contribute to this year's festivities.

The Council has been informed that the County Council will be undertaking footway works in the Lower High Street, outside The Royal Southern Yacht Club, at the beginning of this month. Also the Borough Council will be replacing the large glass recycling bin at Mount Pleasant Recreation Ground with dedicated glass Eurobins to improve this service.

Hamble Local History Society

At its last meeting the Society's Chairman, Ian Underdown, gave an illustrated talk about a business that has been on Hamble Foreshore since the 1930s, now known as the Beach Hut Cafe, but formerly Blue Star Boats and Cafe.

The business was started when Alf Dornom, a chauffeur/skipper for prominent local families, obtained a boatman's licence in 1932, when his last employer sold her boat. He was a Cruising Association Boatman, who hired out dinghies, looked after other people's boats and did mooring work. Alf caused a Public Meeting to be called as he let the Foreshore from Winchester College and parishioners feared the loss of their foreshore rights and its character.

This resulted in the Parish Council leasing and subsequently purchasing the Foreshore. From that time owners of the business had to obtain permission and a licence from the Parish Council to operate from the Foreshore.

When Alf retired, Peter Davies bought the business and was helped by Ernie Stagg, Hamble's postman. Ernie started river trips and when Peter left he continued the business which he called Blue Star Boats. Ernie operated river trips on a more regular basis in 12 seat launches to see the big ocean liners and when there were none he ran trips around TS Mercury. He also hired out dinghies and was greatly helped by local lads.

At the end of the 1950's the business was getting too big to operate by himself, even with help by the youngsters, so he decided to sell to the Borrett family. The Borrett family greatly improved the business by purchasing a larger trip boat that could carry 56 passengers, so the trips could be extended to either Bursledon Bridge or Hamble Point Buoy. They also ran trips to see the ocean liners and for other special events.

Bob and Mary Borrett could not have operated the business without the help of their 4 children. Being a seasonal business Bob and Mary had to undertake other work, particularly during the winter months. At the beginning of the 1970s they asked if they could sell tea and ices from their foreshore hut, but withdrew the request because of objections from other local businesses.

Subsequently Blue Star Boats was sold to Roger Downer and a partner and they were given permission to erect a wooden kiosk to sell refreshments. This was allowed to support the river trips and boat business during bad weather. Renting out moorings also subsidised it during the winter.

The business passed through a number of other owners until Cliff Hall bought it at the beginning of the 1990s. He made a significant investment in it, making huge improvements, particularly with the river trips. The most significant was the construction of a brick kiosk. All previous Councils had only allowed temporary buildings on the Foreshore, due to it being purchased as 'Public Open Space'. It was agreed he could have a 25 year lease in order to write off the capital costs and at the end of that time the kiosk would revert to the Council.

At the beginning of the millennium Clive and Angie Fish took over the business, continuing the river trips, including a River Bus service, but no longer operating a river taxi service. By this time hiring out boats had ceased. A few years later they had outgrown the kiosk's facilities and wished to offer undercover facilities for inclement weather, plus provide a food service throughout the year. After much negotiation they agreed a 100 year lease and planning permission for a cafe/kiosk, which opened in 2010.

In 2014, Richard Beach bought the cafe/kiosk to be managed by his brother Philip, but not the boat business. At the beginning of 2016 it was renamed the Beach Hut Cafe and this will be a new chapter in the history of this Foreshore business.

There was a much larger attendance than expected for this special local interest topic and not a seat to spare. Feedback at the end was that it was a most worthwhile and stimulating compilation of a significant village business' history. Previous owners, their relatives and friends attended and thoroughly enjoyed it. So much so, they shared their memories at the end of the meeting and it was difficult to get them to leave.

REV CHARLES HENVILLE – LOCAL PHILANTHROPIST Rev Charles Henville and his Educational Foundation

Charles Brune Henville was born in 1781 and educated at Winchester College. He went on to New College in Oxford and then returned to be a fellow (governor) of Winchester College from 1814 to his death.

He became Vicar of Portsmouth in 1814 and later Portsea. Rev Henville was a wealthy man and being without a family he spent his wealth freely for the benefit of the parishes in which he served.

In 1838 he became the Vicar of Hamble and Hound and lived in Hamble Rectory. He was responsible for setting up Hamble's first School in 1840 and for raising the funds for its construction. He arranged for the land on which it was built to be gifted from Winchester College. As it was a Church School, he as Vicar was the sole manager of the school.

He leased 3 tenements on the north side of the High Street and in 1842 he pulled them down and erected in their place two dwelling houses of much greater value. Winchester College agreed to purchase one of the houses for £600 which was to be a new house for Manor Farm. The other newly erected house, that was named 'Henville House', was occupied by Rev Philip Thresher.

Rev Charles Henville built the house to be rented out and use its income to support the new school. He then set up the Henville Educational Foundation charity.

The earliest surviving Foundation document states the Trustees may apply a yearly sum not exceeding half its net income towards the cost of maintaining and improving Hamble Church of England School. Also use the income to assist boys and girls resident in the Parish of Hamble to attend schools, institutions and classes other than that provided by elementary education. To promote the education of the boys and girls of the poorer classes in the Parish.

Charles Henville married a widow from Emsworth, Margaret Lind, in 1844. He was interested in local events such as cricket and horticultural societies and supported them financially.

As an example in 1847 he supported the Cottagers Fete which was held at Hamble School. It was reported that there were an immense number of prizes in money, for produce from cottage gardens, which were competed for by the labourers. The resident nobility and gentry visited and after the show over 60 labourers and their wives sat down to a substantial dinner, accompanied by some good ale, at the cost of Rev Charles Henville.

In 1849 the Rev Charles Henville died, but his Henville Educational Foundation charity funded by the rent from 'Henville House' continued.

In 1985 'Henville House' was sold, as more money was needed to maintain the house. The cost of maintenance had resulted in little income to fund the Henville Educational Foundation. The proceeds of the house sale were invested to provide income, so that the Henville Educational Foundation can continue to provide grants today.

Any person under the age of 25 who lives in Hamble, may apply to the Foundation for financial assistance for their education, provided that it is not already available through public funds. Groups or organisations can also apply for grants for those under 25 years of age living within the boundaries of the parish.

The Trustees meet 4 times a year (March, June, September & December) to consider all applications on an individual basis. Further details and application forms may be obtained from the Clerk to the Trustees, Wendy Mason, Tel. 8045 2720. Everything is completely confidential.

MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK

I now have a couple of weeks under my belt as the new Clerk for Hamble-le-Rice. I've been very fortunate to receive a warm welcome from many of the people I've met and the team have been really supportive in helping me to settle in.

I have taken the opportunity this month to seek out some new contributors to the magazine and hope to continue this in the future alongside our valued regular contributors. As well as being a beautiful place to live and work Hamble is home to some very remarkable people and organisations and I would like to show case them and their achievements over the coming months. So if you have a unique story or know someone who has, please get in touch. Watch this space.

Sadly we have over the last few months seen an increase in fly tipping and dumping around the Parish. Today we have had to remove 74 tyres from Westfield Common. Our aim is to ensure that dumped items are removed quickly to prevent harm and to avoid further incidents. It is, however, very expensive and it's a real shame to see money that could be spent on parish priorities going on these types of activities. We will be looking at options to make tipping more difficult on our land but I would ask people to be vigilant and to call us if they see anything suspicious. Sadly in a similar vein BP Oil UK Ltd have told us that they will be closing their Copse Lane car park for the foreseeable future as they too are having problems with fly tipping. Please contact BP on 023 8045 6028 if you have any questions about it.

On a much more positive note the Council have been approached by the Tyro and District Football League and Hampshire FA about providing pitches to enable an under 11's team to form. Currently there are a number of teams around the city but none from the Bursledon, Hound or Hamble area. We are looking at options for College Playing Field and hope that we will be able to support a new youth team next season. We hope it will provide opportunities for local children to get involved in sport and to improve fitness and well-being.

Lastly people walking past the former Barclays Bank building will notice a poster from Eastleigh Borough Council. It confirms that they have purchased the building and are looking to provide a new community facility for Hamble including the provision of a library. The Council have welcomed the news and have asked that there is early consultation with the parish council and the community about proposals. It is an exciting opportunity to create a new facility in the heart of the village.

Eastleigh Borough Council have also confirmed that they are in the process of looking at the consultation comments regarding Coronation Parade and we hope to see how these will be incorporated into the final scheme.



FAREWELL TO EASTLEIGH SOUTHERN PARISHES OLDER PEOPLE'S FORUM (ESPOPF)

On November 15 2016, ESPOPF members met for the last time to celebrate 20 years of lobbying and campaigning for older people in Eastleigh's Southern Parishes and beyond.

The occasion was the launch of a report of ESPOPF's seventh and final piece of research into problems faced by older people, "Alarming Conclusions - older people and emergencies". The research concluded that, since older people could confidently expect to find themselves in emergency situations, it was essential that they develop strategies to prevent them or, at the very least, to cope with them. Examples of some strategies were included.

Two friends of the Forum had been invited to speak: Debbie Beale, former Engagement and Inclusion Officer of Help the Aged and Age UK, and Leela Damodaran, Professor of Participation and Digital Inclusion at Loughborough University. Both paid tribute to the amazing achievements of the Forum in raising awareness of the contribution older people could make to the development of national and international policy when their voices were heard.

Both speakers emphasised the urgent need of national and local government to work with older people, promote age-friendly communities with more digital inclusion, and responsive emergency services. They approved the research report's endorsement of the vital contribution mobile phones could make in emergencies if older people were encouraged to use them.

After a finger-buffet lunch, members reminisced about their memories and experiences of ESPOPF, sampled birthday cake and bubbly and presented an award to Diane Andrewes, in recognition of 20 years of dedicated service as Hon. Secretary. Other long-serving members, Betty Lawrence (Hon. Treasurer) and David Andrewes (research and all-round support) were thanked for their outstanding contributions and Chair, Bernard Brombley, expressed thanks to all members for their involvement.

ESPOPF's website www.espopf.org contains archived copies of research, newsletters and annual reports and will remain for several years. It is hoped that a brief history of ESPOPF will be produced and published on the website during 2017.



STAY SECURE

Homes with no security measures in place are five times more likely to be burgled than those with simple security measures. In most burglaries, the criminals broke into the house or flat through the door, either by forcing the lock or kicking it in. So make sure your doors are strong and secure. Glass panels on doors are particularly vulnerable. If you have one on your door you could replace it with laminated glass, which is stronger. Good window locks and strong deadlocks can make a big difference.

Taking just a few steps can make a big difference in keeping your home safe from burglary. Here are a few tips:

- * Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're just out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors (lift handle and turn key)
- * Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook keys through the letterbox)
- * Install a visual burglar alarm
- * Install good outside lighting
- * Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property
- * Leave radios or lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied
- * Make sure the fences around your garden are in good condition
- * Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immoveable object inside a locked shed or garage
- * Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home
- * Ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property
- * Ensure rear fencing is in good repair
- * Improve natural surveillance at the front of your property i.e. trim high hedges
- * Mark your property with postcode and house number and register your property for free with Immobilise www.immobilise.com
- * Consider joining or forming a Neighbourhood Watch scheme www.ourwatch.org.uk
- * Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows
- * Store any high value items (i.e. jewellery, passports) in a properly secured safe or bank vault

If you're not sure who is at your door, don't open it. Check the identity of the caller by calling the company they are claiming to be from i.e. gas, electricity, water and police. Use the telephone numbers listed in your local directory or provided independently by your service provider - Do not use any telephone numbers provided by the caller - they may be bogus.


