Planning review meeting comments


There are no planning applications for 2024 as of yet.

- We had a Christmas Craft morning for the children that was very successful, we continue to have the monthly NHS hearing aid visits, Bramley Knitwits and the ever popular Rhymetime.
- We have another two volunteers starting their training this month.
- There appear to be some issues with the library system when returning books, we monitor.
- In 2023, TRAID (clothing bin located outside the library) collected 2,818 kg of unwanted clothes and shoes from the donation bank on your site. This reduced carbon emissions (CO2) by 23.9 tonnes and water savings of the equivalent of 4,508 m3.
