A66 Northern Trans Pennine Project - Highways England are launching their consultation proposals on Friday 24th September to Saturday 6th November. Hard copies of key consultation materials will be sent to residents within 5km of the A66. They are hosting drop-in sessions in Bowes on Friday 1st October at 8pm in the village hall and again on Saturday 2nd October 9am – 4pm. Information has been put on the website.

We have received a brochure from Elan City who sell traffic control & public communication systems. We have not had a reply from Durham County Council about this but other Parish Councils have been requesting information from Clerks regarding these products.

Clerk to contact Staindrop Clerk, we have all seen the temporary device in Staindrop, how much was it and where did they get it from? We will need planning permission to erect a permanent display.

7. **Cemetery & Village maintenance**

Cllr Tipping met Rob George from Climate County Durham regarding tree planting in our conservation area. Rob also discussed the area next to the A66 and will need to speak to Durham County Council.

Cllr White has visited the cemetery at Kirby Stephens to see how they deal with their Yew trees. Photo's attached. It appears that they have been doing a lot of cutting. It was decided that Cllr White would contact Castle Garden Services. Cllr Carlisle to contact P Simpson for an alternative quote. Prices to be brought back for the next meeting. There are several ancient Yews that can only be cut back by one third.

Allotments 8

The new Allotment holder has returned the signed agreement. An allotment has asked for permission to pop a small shed 6'x4' in her allotment at the western side – permission granted, usual caveats may need to be taken down at the end of tenancy.

Work on the gate is in their hands now, we have had a quote for £150.00 from P Holden Ltd.

10 Parish Paths

We have received £177.00 from the Parish Paths Partnership for repair work to a stile. Bull banks have been strimmed and several parishioners have commented on how much better it looks. Cllr White has submitted another grant application for £1,215.60.

Clerk contacted Mike Ogden regarding the consultation on the proposed British Horse Society modification of the definitive map from Sleightholme to Tan Hill. Dagmar Richardson replied confirming that the Council and affected parties will be consulted.
