NEWS FROM ALL SAINTS' CHURCH, HARBY WITH SWINETHORPE – *Bridget Wells*

The concert in church on August 25th with The Cherry Stone Duo was excellent. Our thanks to William and Emily. We think this is the first time a harp has been played in the church.

A record number of cyclists, raising money for The Connection at St. Martin-in-the-Fields, set off from the church yard, at the start of the Bank Holiday weekend, after a blessing by Rev. Ken Potter. The first stop was a Lincoln Cathedral and the last, at the tomb of Queen Eleanor in Westminster Abbey.

The wedding of Daniel Lilley and Alexandra Bradley was held on August 21st. Best wishes to them. It was lovely to hear the bells ringing.

Harby Playing Fields Update

There have been significant changes at the playing field this year. Firstly, an almost complete change of committee members. After many years of great service to the village and the surrounding area Steve Hogg and his team handed over the reins to a new set of villagers to build on their achievements. The current Playing Fields Committee would like to offer our thanks to everyone for their commitment over the years.

The key players in the new team are:-

Lionel Thursby - Chair, Matt Tucker - Treasurer, Pat Mackenzie - Secretary

This team is supported by 7 further villagers.

We also have a group of volunteers to help whenever tasks arise. We would like this group to be much larger so that many hands can make light work of the repairs, maintenance and upgrades that are required. Currently, the time being invested is concentrated on a small number of individuals, if you can, please contact us and offer to get involved, it would be much appreciated !

What's happening or planned.....

PLAY AREA

After a great deal of effort and application of skills Alex managed to obtain a grant to replace condemned play equipment and upgrade the range of equipment. The Grant required us to contribute a sum from reserves to make a total of 50k inc vat.

After discussion, the committee decided to focus the grant to obtain high quality, low maintenance equipment which increased the variety and also ensured that there was a transition of experiences for infants through to teenagers, whilst providing a proportional approach to less able users. The Queen Eleanor school children were consulted about what equipment they would like to be added.

A decision was also reached that the monies should be spent on purchasing equipment rather than surfacing of the areas and that we would undertake some aspects of the works ourselves to make best use of the grant.

The new equipment is now in place and awaiting quality and safety inspections, we hope to open parts of the facilities at the start of October.

The mound of soil is the base for reusing an embankment slide which we own, this was not part of the works covered by the grant and is an ongoing village project. This also allowed us to redirect the money that would have been used for the disposal of that spoil.

We have removed the bark area previously surrounding the infant play. The whole area was levelled with imported soil and seeded.

Thanks must be given here to Trevor Medley, Mark Fearn and Chris Medley for their generosity of time, skills and specialist equipment.

The fall protection is now provided by rubber matting to the new and some existing equipment with the gravel area retained to the high climbing frame zone.

Due to the very dry summer period and the construction machinery involved the seeded areas have suffered and need some time to recover so please be patient as this occurs over the next few months.

CAR BOOTS

These have continued on a biweekly basis shared with North Scarle. The last two for this year are 19th September and 3rd October. The attendance of vendors and buyers this year has been mixed. The events have been run by, and for the benefit of, various village groups. If your group would like to run a car boot, please contact us.

FIREWORKS DISPLAY 5TH NOVEMBER 6PM

After two years of cancellations due to weather and COVID the event is back on !!!

Professional firework display, bonfire, food and music. Firework and other costs have risen therefore the entrance fee will be £5 for everyone above the age of 15. Cash only payments is our current request. All proceeds to the playing field running costs.

Bonfires are a tradition that we would like to maintain however they do harm the environment. In recognition of this we have sourced the materials from a managed source. The less controlled additions of garden waste etc. will no longer be available so **please do not add anything to the bonfire**. The gates will be locked with a new padlock and **no access will be permitted**.

We need in excess of 20 volunteers to run this effectively and safely so please let us know how you can help!! We need help with food preparation and serving, car parking, entrance fees, setting up and dismantling safety fencing. This is our major fund-raising event and needs to go well.

Seasonal Flu Vaccination Campaign 2021

We will be holding 2 Saturday morning flu clinics on

Saturday 18 September 2021, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm

Saturday 23 October 2021, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm

We are aiming to vaccinate 100% of eligible patients this year, as defined by NHS guidelines. We may be able to open our offer beyond those eligible after 31 October 2021 (dependent on stocks/uptake).

Saturday clinics will focus on patients who are able to walk and stand unaided for up to 20 minutes. No seating available. Flu Vaccinations (and possibly 3rd COVID vaccine once details are confirmed) will be administered with patients stood up and a strict one-way system through the Practice will be in operation. We will continue to wear face coverings to protect your healthcare setting.

For patients with mobility issues we will be holding weekday flu clinics. Our PCAs will triage at the time of booking.

Housebound patients will be contacted by the practice in due course.
