Fill your kitchen with the smell of Christmas with this juicy gammon joint in a cinnamon-spiced stock, added with a sticky syrup and clove glaze. The coke adds a sweet treacly flavour to balance the saltiness of the ham.

Christmas Cola Ham with Maple and Mustard Glaze

2kg unsmoked boneless gammon joint
2 litres of cola (not diet)
1 carrot, chopped
1 onion, peeled and quartered
1 stick of celery, chopped
1 cinnamon stick
1/2 tablespoon of black peppercorns
1 bay leaf

For the glaze:150ml of maple syrup
2 tablespoon of wholegrain mustard
2 tablespoon of red wine vinegar
A pinch of ground cloves or five-spice

- 1. Put the unsmoked boneless gammon joint in a large pan and cover with the 2 litres of cola. Add the chopped carrot, quartered onion, chopped celery stick, cinnamon stick, the peppercorns and the bay leaf.
- 2. Bring to the boil, then turn down to simmer for around 2 ½ hrs, topping up with boiling water if necessary to keep the gammon fully covered.
- 3. Carefully pour the liquid away, then let the ham cool a little while you heat the oven to 190C (170C fan).

- 4. Lift the ham into a roasting tin, then cut away the skin leaving behind an even layer of fat. Score the fat all over in a criss-cross pattern.
- 5. Mix the maple syrup, wholegrain mustard, wine vinegar and a pinch of ground cloves or five-spice in a jug. Pour half over the fat, roast for 15 mins, then pour over the rest and return to the oven for another 30 mins, baste half way through.
- 7. Remove from the oven and allow to rest for 10 mins, then spoon more glaze over the top.

CIIr Turner opened meeting and welcomed CIIr Davies and CIIr Karen Chappell-Tay to their first meetings along with three members of public

Liz asked the Council to consider placing the gates at the Headcorn end of the village at Triangle Cottage, introducing a 20mph limit in Church Road and moving the 30mph sign on Woodcock Lane to a point adjacent to the public footpath entrance. Clirs noted the suggestions and explained the need to first put in place the measures currently proposed before moving on to these suggestions which will be kept in mind
- Maidstone Borough Council/Kent County Council Cllr Karen Chappell-Tay reported on the following:
 - Councillor's grants to Parish of £500. Has to be spent by 31st March. Applications required ASAP, Karen will send details to the Clerk
 - Ash Gardens noted appeal. Karen will let the Clerk have details of all applications and appeals close to, but outside, the Parish and ask MBC why we have not been consulted
 - South East Rail have nominated Headcorn Station for a disability adaptation grant to improve access. They are priority number 4
 - MBC have supported the application for the Greensand Ridge to become an AONB

- Park and Ride subsidy to be removed to the tune of £160K.
- Local Plan Review to commence February 2019


Road Closure

The team of volunteers has been working hard to form what will be the Lenham Community Gym Club and hopes to have everything in place early in November for you to re-join. Until then, please continue to use the gym. Our plan is to start charging membership fees on the 1st December and on the first of the month thereafter by direct debit, but we will accept cash and cheque payments.

The membership fees will remain the same as they are now:

£28 adults (18 and over) - £23 concessions (seniors and under eighteens) - £50 family membership (2 adults + 2 children) - walk-ins £2.50 (16 to under18 year olds) and £5 adults (18 and over) per session.



What does Christmas mean for you? The Church of England's slogan for this year is "Follow the star" (you can follow it on twitter), but what star will each of us follow? What does Christmas bring us this year? For some there will be joyous family reunions, for some well, just family reunions (!), and for some sadness and loneliness. Most of us will enjoy twinkling lights in a crisp evening sky. And, of course, there will be that relentless B-word buzzing around us all the time, of which we are all so tired. (A recent survey showed that more people just wanted Brexit over with than cared what the actual outcome was.)

Pause and think: what's your *favourite* thing about Christmas. Mine – yes actually more than presents! – is the sense of peace that comes as the whole mad world just slows down a bit, reflects a little and opens up to wonder. One of the reasons I like midnight Communion so much is that those three elements are combined there, but there may be other times as well when you are able to relax, look out at this wonderful world in which we live, and be thankful.

At the heart of Christmas is a destination that was totally unexpected by...well, everybody. The destination was a new-born baby, born in poverty, who grew up to be a teacher so profound, a worker of miracles so flabbergasting, that his followers recognised him as being God, and that in Him they recognised God's message to us as being a call to love.

May your heart and feet take you this Christmas to discover that same baby, and in him that same God, and in him that same call to love. Maybe join us in a local church to help take you there? You would be so welcome.
